Prof. J. L. Redus, superintendent of the city school for the past year has filed his final report for the year with the coun-
ty-superintendent of public in-ty-superintendent of public in-
struction. The report is very struction. The report is very
exhaustive and relates to the exhaustive and relates to the
school matters and shows statistics on nearly every point of the school work.
The report as filed shows that
there was a total enroliment for the year of 405 of which 182 were males and 223 were females. This enrollment was divided as follows: Pupils of age between 7 and 17; males 168, females. 202, total 370: pupils over 17 years of age, males 9 , females 10 , total
19; pupils under 7 years of 19; pupils under 7 years of age, males 5 , females 11 , total 16 .
The report shows The report shows a total
school day attendance of 48662, days divided as follows:- Pupils between 7 and 17 years old male 20800, female $23978.1-2$ mate 20800 , remale $447781 \cdot 2$; over 17 years age, males 1286, females 1468 total 2754; under 7 years; males 326 1-2, females 804, total 11301-2: - With relation to the teachers, there-were eight employed, of whom three were males and five females, the male teachers hav ing taught a total of 522 days and the females 573, a total of
1392 .
There were eleven graduates three males and eight females.
With reference to expendi tures, the male teachers were pares, $\$ 1265$, the females $\$ 2520$ a total of $\$ 3785$.
With reference to actual at tendance the percentage based upon the actual school enrobllment for the district was 136
and the percentage of attendance with relation to the actual attendance was $691-2$ per cent. As to the property, the school building and goods are valued at $\$ 15,000$, the furniture at $\$ 900$, the library at $\$ 136$, and the ap paratus at $\$ 40$ with a total of about 200 volumes in the schoo library. There are 306 single desks, 87 double desks and eight teachers desks. There are eight rooms provided with desks one not provided with them.
