



Easy Potato Bake

Prep Time: 10 minutes Baking time: 35 minutes

1 package (32 ounces) frozen Southern-style hash brown potatoes 1 container (16 ounces) Sour Cream

1 package (8 ounces) Shredded Cheddar Cheese

1 can (103/4 ounces) condensed cream of chicken soup 1 cup each chopped green onions and corn flake crumbs

2 Tbsp. butter or margarine, melted MIX potatoes, sour cream, cheese, soup and onions in large

bowl.

SPOON into greased 13 x 9-inch baking dish. Toss crumbs and butter; sprinkle over potato mixture.

BAKE at 375°F for 35 minutes. Makes 12 to 16 servings.

Prep Time: 15 minutes plus refrigerating 1 package (8 ounces) Cream Cheese

1/3 cup sugar

1 tub (8 ounces) COOL WHIP Whipped Topping, thawed 1 prepared graham cracker crumb crust (6 ounce or 9 inch) BEAT cream cheese and sugar in large bowl with wire whisk or electric mixer on high speed until smooth. Gently stir in whipped topping.

SPOON into crust. Refrigerate 3 hours or until set. Garnish with thin apple slices and curled orange peel. Store leftover cheesecake in refrigerator. Makes 8 servings.



New Truck Speed imig **Effective September 1**

The Texas Department of Transportation will remove the 60 mph day/55 mph night speed limit signs for trucks by 5:00 p.m. Wednesday. September 1 is the effective date for the new truck speed limit on all interstate, U.S. and state highways. There will no longer be a difference in speed limits for cars and large trucks on many Texas highways. The law applies to both rural and urban areas.

House Bill 676 passed by the 76th Legislative session changed the law to reflect the desire to have all vehicles travel at a more uniform speed. It is generally considered safer for all vehicles traveling on the same road to travel the same speed rather than varying speeds.

Texas Forts Trail by Lisa Sanders

One of the greatest events in the history of the western frontier was the arrival of the stagecoaches carrying mail and passengers from Saint Louis and San Francisco. These semi-weekly coaches of Butterfield the Overland Mail Company began on September 15, 1858 and continued to run until the beginning of the Civil War. This direct rapid and communication was vital to the settling of the frontier. Fort Belknap was used as a depot where mules were kept to pull the stage through Indian Territory. Here the stagecoach horses were replaced by mules; no self-respecting Comanche would ride a mule! The Mail route followed the military road from Jacksboro, Fort Belknap, then Fts. Phantom Hill and Chadbourne.

This September, both travel and communication along these military roads Ave improved dramatically and the attractions and sites could not be busier.


