

A new Castro County Hospita vill not be built unless at least half the price can be obtained through a Hill-Burton federal hospital building grant. The federal self on this aid until a bond elec tion passes, but local hospital pro moters have been generally led to understand that the aid will b forthcoming if the election passes The face amount of the bond election will not build the type of hoscounty, so it is considered that the federal grant is absolutely necessary and no construction will begin until the government definitely commits itself.

In August, 1958 a bond election o construct a new hospital failed by a vote of 480-419. That was a \$290,000 election which aimed at building a new hospital without the aid of Hill-Burton funds.

The first movement for this election came earlier this year when 300 persons signed petitions calling for another bond election. The petitions were circulated by the Dimmitt JayCee-Ettes and Dimmitt Garden Club. Little feeling has been registered
