# Long Rain Boosts Fall Crop Hopes

Castro County, like much of the rest of the Texas Panhandle, and most of New Mexico and Oklahoma, has spent this week slogging through a sea of mud and rain-water.

Totally overcast skies have been the weather fare since late Monday evening when tightly spaced cumulous clouds gave way to the solid overcast about dark. The rain started Monday night, registering 1.56 inches on the rain gauge of Dimmitt weatherman Howard Cook, Cook, who is a representative of the U.S. Weather Bureau here, makes rain readings at 7 o'clock each morning. His gauge showed only .42 inches for Tuesday and Tuesday night, but rainfall increased to 1.50 inches Wednesday night and 1.05 until noon Thursday. Cook reported a total of 4.71 inches since Sunday night.

The rain has been almost continuous since Tuesday evening, sometime dropping to a slow drizzle. The slow, pattering rain is sinking through topsoil and into subsoil, making continued crop prospects the best in years.

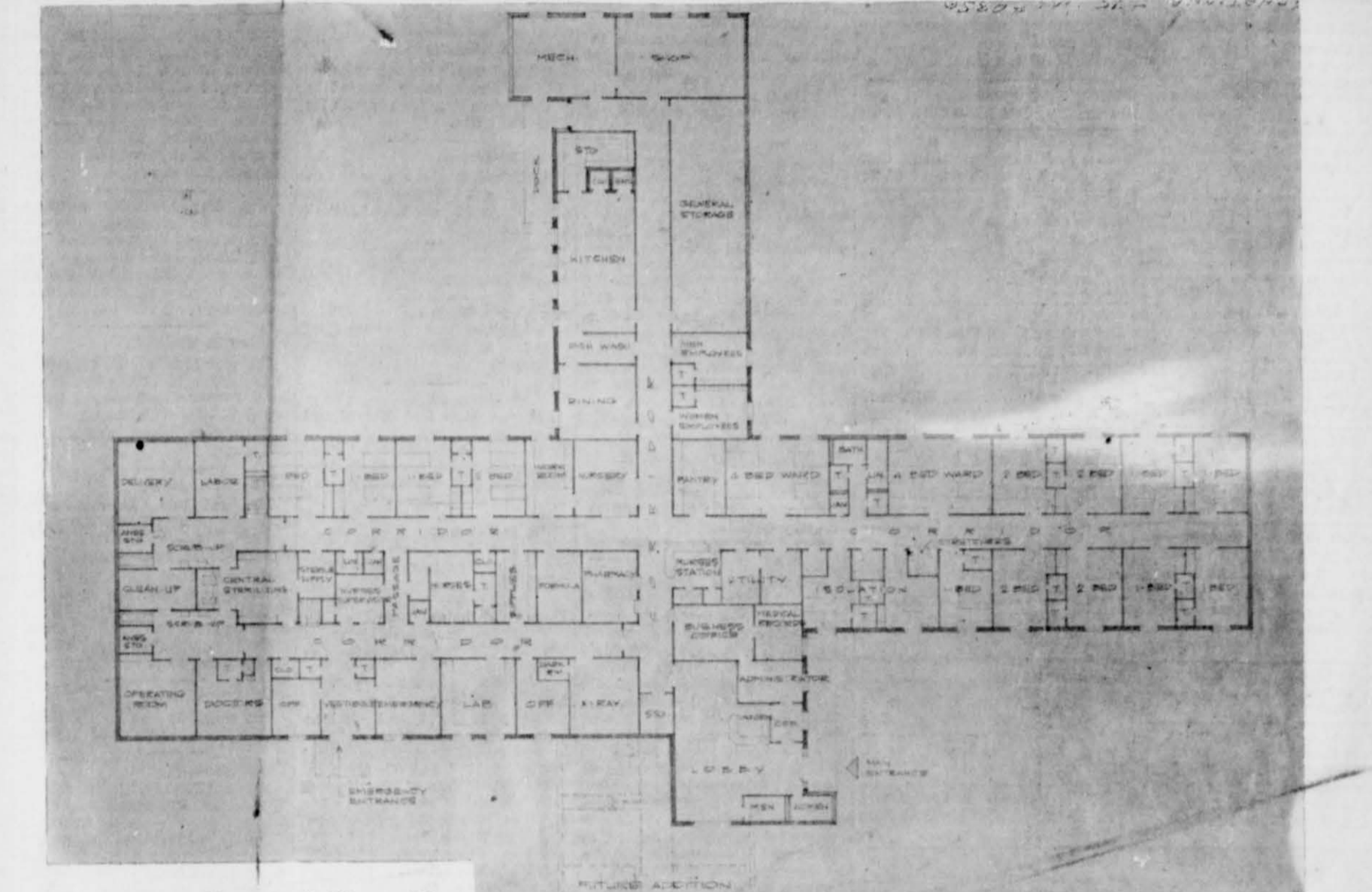

# Hospital Bond Vote Saturday

Castro County's long-awaited hospital bond election will be held in the fifteen voting precincts Saturday.

Voters will be given the choice of accepting or rejecting the issuance of \$225,000 in bonds for a \$450,000 hospital.

The commissioners court and promoters of the hospital bond issue have worked out an arrangement that will give Castro County property-owners the biggest hospital bargain they're apt to ever see in the election passes.

A new Castro County Hospital will not be built unless at least half the price can be obtained through a Hill-Burton federal hospital building grant. The federal government will not commit itself on this aid until a bond election passes, but local hospital promoters have been generally led to understand that the aid will be forthcoming if the election passes. The face amount of the bond election will not build the type of hospital deemed necessary for the county, so it is considered that the federal grant is absolutely necessary and no construction will begin until the government definitely commits itself.

In August, 1958 a bond election to construct a new hospital failed by a vote of 480-419. That was a \$290,000 election which aimed at building a new hospital without the aid of Hill-Burton funds.

The first movement for this election came earlier this year when 300 persons signed petitions calling for another bond election. The petitions were circulated by the Dimmitt Jay-Cee-Ettes and Dimmitt Garden Club.

Little feeling has been registered around the county concerning the election. Most people favoring the election say that anyone who votes

and it would be located adjacent to and just southwest of the present building on the same property. The floor plan is arranged so that all patient rooms are up and down hall from the central nurses desk.

It will be as fine a hospital building as owned by any county of this size in this area if the election is favorable.

Less than a dozen people had voted absentee by the final day Tuesday.

But a new hospital will cost the taxpayers through direct county and state evaluation increases.

The tax structure is difficult to evaluate and explain. However, as a general rule, there will be a 20 percent county and state tax increase over last year. Taxes last year were lower than 1958 and previously due to a lowered evaluation. This means that the tax increase will be about 15 percent over the 1958 level if the election carries.

As an example of the increase, a man whose farm and personal property is worth about \$80,000, paid about \$77.50 in 1959 on state and county taxes or \$85.00 in the year 1958. His taxes will be increased to \$95.00 in 1961 and later on if the election carries. He will pay about \$17.50 more than last year or about \$10 more than year before last.

This is necessarily a generalization and subject to some slight variation. Taxes will be raised through an increase in evaluation if the voters approve the issue. The amount of increase cannot be definitely determined until it is learned the length of time necessary to retire the bonds. The increase will vary between 15 and 20 percent depending on when—between 12 and 17 years—the bonds mature.

Another example of the increase in taxes in the city would be like this: If a man owns \$10,000 worth of home, auto and personal property, his taxes will increase from about \$15.50 in 1958 (or \$14.80 in 1960) to about \$17.75 in 1961 if the issue passes. Again, these figures are broad generalizations, but should be fairly typical. A taxpayer can get an idea of his own situation by scaling these figures up or down.
