**NUT LOAF.**  
Mrs. Hutchins.

1 cup chopped walnuts  
1 cup raisins  
4 cups flour  
2 cups milk  
1-2 cup sugar  
4 teaspoonfuls baking powder  
1 teaspoonful salt  
1 egg

Sift dry ingredients together, add raisins, nuts, milk and eggs. Put in milk and egg and let rise in a greased pan 30 minutes. Bake 50 minutes.

**BAKED MACARONI AND MUSHROOMS.**

Break one-half pound of macaroni into two-inch pieces and boil twenty minutes. Drain. Peel ten mushrooms and stir in a little milk for a few minutes. Put a layer of the macaroni in a buttered dish, then a layer of thick tomato sauce, then a layer of the mushrooms and another layer of macaroni, seasoning each layer with paprika and salt. Sprinkle grated cheese over the top, and bake in oven for half an hour.

**TIT TAT TOO CAKE.**

4 eggs  
2 1-2 cups sugar  
1-2 cup butter  
1 cup milk  
2 1-2 cups flour  
2 teaspoons baking powder

Divide the dough into three equal parts. To one part add 1 cup raisins 1 teaspoon of cinnamon. To second layer add 2 tablespoonfuls chocolate and 1 teaspoonful vanilla. To the last layer add lemon flavor to taste.

When baked, put chocolate layer on bottom, fruit layer next and white layer on top.

**BROWN BREAD.**

2 cups sour milk  
1-2 cup molasses  
1 egg  
1 teaspoonful soda  
2 cups graham flour  
2 cups corn meal  
Pinch of salt. Steam three hours.

**MORE ABOUT FETERITA**

So much that is not true has been written about this plant, and so much ignorance exists concerning it that I feel that it is time that the public should be enlightened.

When I first started to introduce it into the state, many irresponsible stories were circulated concerning the plant, and some newspapers, not having correct information about it, drew on the imaginations of the editors, and printed columns of wild misinformation that has left the impression on the minds of many people that feterita is, like some other much-heralded crops, of no practical value. The results obtained on the Demonstration farms, and at the various schools and experiment stations where it has been tried, all tend to prove that it is not only of practical value but has many points of superiority over both of the more familiar grain-sorghums, milo and kaffir.

The feterita which I sent out over the state while Superintendent of Demonstration farms, is not the true Soudan Doura and white milo. The name "feterita" is also applied to the true doura, but should be used only in reference to the cross. The result so obtained has been given various trials to determine its value as compared with milo and kaffir. It was first tried on the Demonstration farms. In a two years'

test on these farms, the feterita out-yielded both kaffir and milo more than 20 per cent, and matured in ten days less time than did milo and in more than twenty days less time than kaffir. This is a better showing than appears on the face of it as the two years mentioned were the crop seasons of 1910 and 1911, two of the driest seasons in the history of Oklahoma. Also on some of the farms where planted late, the feterita matured while the milo and kaffir, requiring more time, were caught by the frost.

In the spring of 1912 I felt that the results obtained justified the widespread introduction of the plant over the state. So, under authority of the State Board of Agriculture, I offered to send out free one-half pound packages of the seed to all who applied within a certain specified time. In all I received more than 2,000 applications and about 1,800 packages were sent out. On each package was sent a blank on which results were to be reported. These blanks were designed to show, when properly filled in, the date and manner of planting, cultivating, and harvesting, the yield as compared with milo and kaffir under the same conditions, and the comparative feeding value of both the grain and forage. These reports are now coming in by dozens and show a remarkable unanimity. A summary of these reports shows the following facts to be true, in the opinion of the practical farmers who made the tests. 1st, that feterita out-yields both milo and kaffir, especially under conditions of drouth. 2nd, that it matures from ten to thirty days earlier than milo or kaffir. 3rd, that the grain is equal in every way to the other two sorghums mentioned. 4th, that the forage seems to be equal to that of kaffir.

These are the results obtained by practical farmers under ordinary field conditions in Oklahoma. Tests carried on at the secondary agricultural schools bear these out thoroughly, and the reports from the demonstration farms show results that are even more favorable to feterita.

When the plant was first given to the public, many persons who were not familiar with the conditions, reached the conclusion that feterita was one of several undesirable sorghums previously known. One of the farm papers of the state has evidently been mistaking it for shallu, an entirely different sorghum, and one of very little value.

In conclusion let me say that I am convinced that this sorghum is one of the most profitable that can be grown in Oklahoma, particularly under conditions of drouth. I am more than satisfied with the part that I have played in bringing it to public notice.

The citizens of Canyon will entertain the Panhandle Press association on Saturday, April 12. Each newspaper man and woman in the entire Plains country is expected to be in Canyon on that day to assist in making the program the most interesting of any ever given in Texas.

Too Many Large Farms

"There are too many large farms in Texas and the average Texas farmer is trying to do to much", said Judge S.A. Lindsey of Tayler, who, as Chairman of the Texas Farm Life Commission is directing the work of that body.

The Commission will begin an investigation into the causes that maintain this undesirable condition at an early date and Randall county will come within the scope of the inquiry as the Federal Census Reports show 183 farms in this country that contain more than 500 acres.

The average size farm in Randall county is 767.2 acres, which is 498.1 acres over the State's average.

We have a total of 363 farms in this country while the total number for the State is 417,770

The average size of a Texas farm is 269 acres while those of Ohio and Indiana contain 71 and 78 acres, respectively, according to Federal Census figures. There are 23,956 farms and ranches in this state that contain more than 500 acres and Texas ranks first with other States in the Union in this respect. A large number of these tracts are said to be held for speculative purposes and only a small portion are being used. The classification by size is shown in the following table for Randall county.

### Commissioners Court.

The following business has been transacted in the commissioners' court:

The First National Bank was selected as county depository, paying 5.55 per cent interest on daily balances.

Mrs. W. B. Jones was allowed \$45 per quarter for support, it being shown she had no means of support.

I. W. McClure, Dave Curry, T. C. Thompson, W. C. Baird and Sam Lofton were appointed as a jury to review a road petitioned by E. Edmunds and thirteen others, beginning at the S. W. corner of section 88 and the N. W. corner of section 105, in block 6, I. & G. N. Ry. Co. land, thence east to the S. E. corner of section 92 and the N. E. corner of section 101, the whole distance being five miles. The jury will report next term.

\$70,000 was set at the bond for the First National bank as county depository.

The yearly reports of the various officers were examined and approved.

On petition of E. Edmunds a new school district was made, comprising parts of district 1, 9 and 10, with the following boundaries: Beginning at the S. W. corner of section 106, block No. 6, I. & G. N. R. R. Co. survey, thence with three miles to the N. W. corner section 74, thence east one mile to N. E. corner section 74, thence north two miles to N. W. corner section 41, thence east three miles to N. E. corner section 39, thence south two miles to S. E. corner section 58, thence east 5 1-2 miles to county line, thence south three miles to line section 97 and 128, thence west to point of beginning, including the following whole sections, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 87, 88, 89, 90, 91, 102, 103, 104, 105, 106, 66, 67, 68, 69, 92, 93, 94, 95, 98, 99, 100, 101, 39, 40, 41, 56, 57, 58 and parts of the following sections, 65, 96, 97, all in block 6, I. & G. N. R. R. Co. survey, said district to be numbered 21, and known as the Edmunds school house.

It was ordered that the lines of school district No. 9, be extended as follows. Beginning at the S. W. corner of section 196, thence east one mile to S. E. corner of section No. 196, thence north 6 miles to N. E. corner of section 125, thence west two miles to N. W. corner of section 124, thus adding to said district sections 124, 125, 132, 133, 156, 157, 164, 165, 188, 189, 196, 197, block 6, I. & G. N. Ry. Co. survey.

### SPECIAL SESSION.

The work of the court was not completed by Saturday night and Judge Coss called the court in a special session Monday to complete checking the tax and settling with the collector and examining other reports of the county officials.

The bond of the First National bank for \$70,000 was approved.

Dr. D. M. Stewart was appointed health officer for the coming year.

\$200 was appropriated to the use of the Civic Improvement League, for the purpose of improving the cemetery, especially the front fence.

The southwest quarter of court yard was ordered to be tiled, well manured and sown to blue grass under the supervision of Judge Coss.

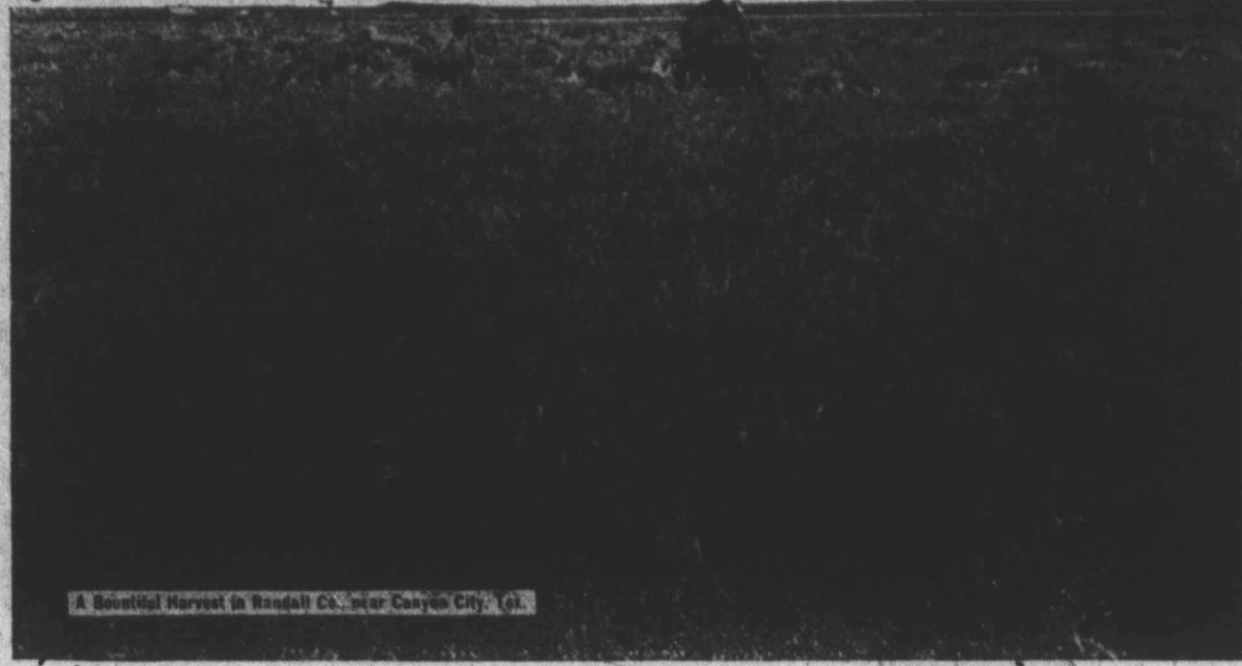
Tuesday was spent examining some bridges near the city and the court adjourned Tuesday afternoon.

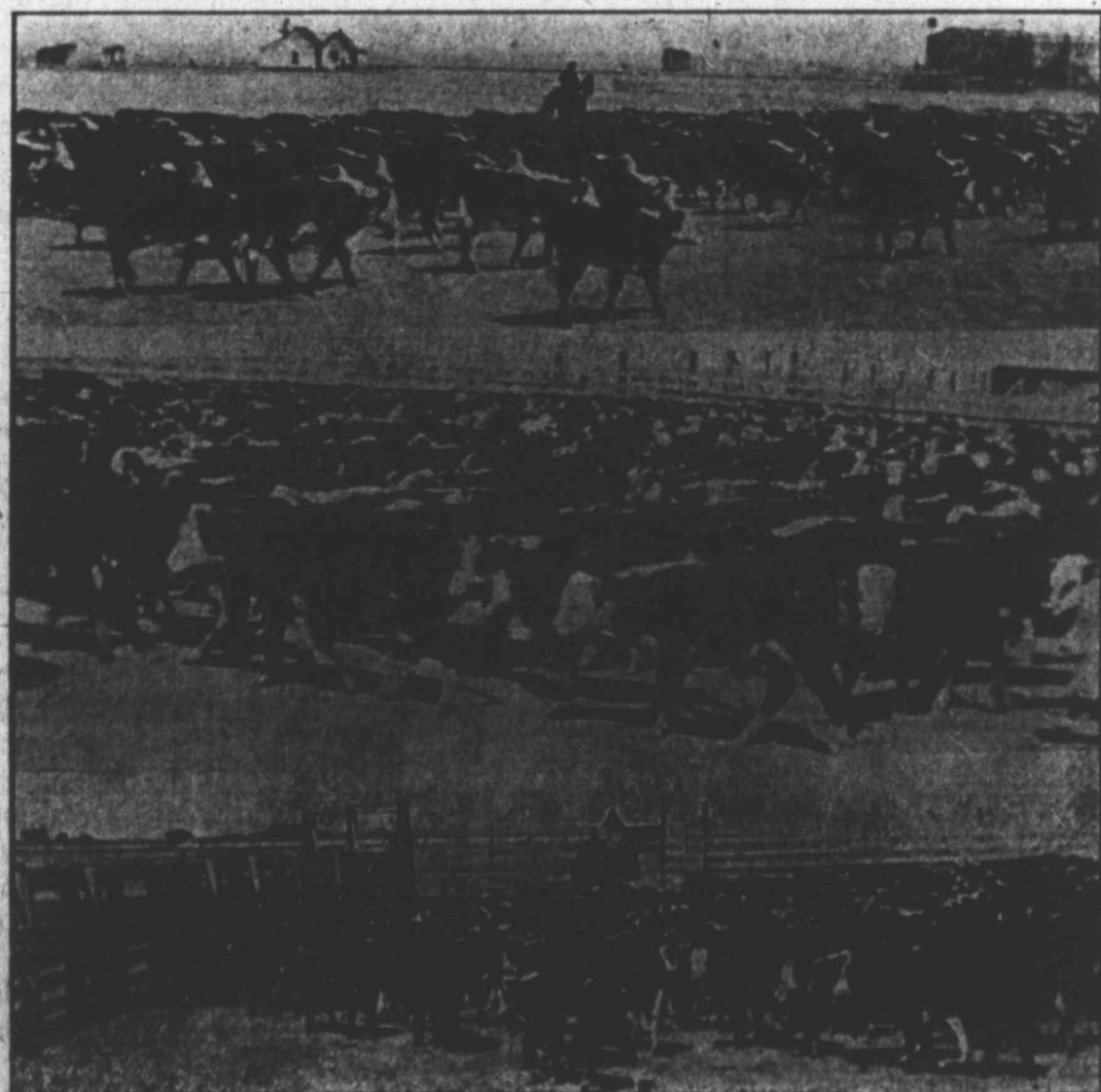
