## Planting Kafir, Maize, and Feterita

 The following methods for handling Katir'; Milo Maize and Feterita are practical, The Agparturent of the Santa Fe System recommend that their cooperators follow out these sug.estions as nearly as conditions will permit.
The Crrps.-All of us know that kafir and milo are the corn crops for this country. We rec ommend that the total acreage of
these two crops, planted on each these two crops, planted on each
farm, be about equally divided farm, be about equally divided,
Feterita belongs to the same Feterita belongs to the same
family as kafir and milo. We do not know that it is any more drouth resistant than these other crops. It requires the sathe tillage methods.
Preparation of.Seed Bed-All of these crops are good sod crops and often make good yields under these conditions with little preparation and no cultivation,
yet they respond to good tillage yet they respond to good tillage as unch any crops, especially
under land conditions. The ground \& should be thoroughly and deeply prepared either by plowing or listing. Fall work of this kind is preferred. We d not know any better method
than to list deep in the fall. We than to list deep in the fall. We from running a sub-soiler several inches deep in the bottom of these:furrow immediately fol lowing the lister. This provides a good safe place for quick stor age of moisture which may fal at any time before planting. As soon as any moistare has fallen and the ridges become dry
enough to work, they should be enough to work, they should be
harrowed, this is especially ad harrowed, this is especially ad-
visable for tight laids. On sandy visable for tight lainds. On sandy
lauds, it is often best to culti lauds, it is often best to culti-
vate the ridges rather than har row them, especially Hf there is danger of blowing. All crust should be, kept broken and al planting time. When deep plow ing cannot be done at the prow tims (early), we prefer listing rather than shallow plowing Where possible, always double list-list early' and work ridges until planting time, then re-list and plant immediately.
Contouring and Terracing.All listing, furrows, especially
planting furrows, should be run on the contour, which meanis that they should be run directly across the slope and not up and
down it. This plan prevents down it. This plan prevents
water from running off-a fiel even during a heavy rain, but may call for very winding rows
in some fields. However, the in some fields. However, the
question of looks is of minor im portance.
Planting. - These orops should de planted in furrows, regardless of whether the ground was plow
or listed. Best results come from planting two rows at time in these furrows with two row planter. The planter
covers the seed and packs the covers the seed and packs the
