The bigh school sent no exhibit owing to the large amount of work the students have on hand.
The exhibit starts with the little folks of the first and second grades where they do principal. ly such things as cut out paper take the first step into, weaving and basket making, frame pictures, make little baskets and rugs and start free hand drawing. The exhibit will also co ing and figures done by the p pils of the first grade. marvelous what excellent steps the little people take in this line of work when their energy is di -
rected correctly. Miss Garre son has charge of this room and the exhibit speaks highly for her ability.
The exhibit from the thira and fourth grades contains larger variety of articles an of more complex nature. Ther is found basket work, mats, pic ture frames, various kinds of drawings and water colors, pa per cuttings, hand bags, nap kins, dust caps, aprons, laundry bags. bonnets, pin cushions an rugs. There were many articles of fancy work from this grade that would puzzle the capabilities of experienced ladies. All of
the work was done in the room under the-direction of the teach er, Miss Avis Baird, who has had a great deal of experience in this line of work.
The fifth, sixth and seventh grade work is under the direc-
tion of Miss Minnie Conner. Corresponding to the advance in age of the pupils, the work of these grades advance in complexities. Life studies are of the most interesting in these grades.
