If the first plan is accepted and the mill leased, some good man will be placed in charge to buy the wheat on small enough mar-

ling and allow for his salary. At three o'clock next Saturday
afternoon will be another meet ing of the farmers, and the off cials trust that all will be pres ent to discuss the plans as so far erolved.
