nation like ourr, whoses military and anval power, even if greatly augmented in the near future, will be used for defense only, and not to aid inexcusable territorial aggrandizement.
The great value of aircraft as a life saver on water, as illustrated by the aero coast patrol system advocated by our National Aerial Coast Patrol
commission is acknowledged. Let us now consider briefly the coming activities of the aircraft on land.
. One of the great uses for aeroplanes in the near future will be as fire fighters. The time is almost at hand when giant planes, larger than any
we know of now, and with a speed greatly above the average of 85 to 100 miles an hour which prevails at the present time, will be equipped essen-
tially like land fire apparatus. Rushing without hindrance through the air at 150 to 200 miles an hour, carrying fire-fighting apparatus and expe-
rienced firemen, fully equipped aerial fire departments will dash toward rienced fremen, fully equipped aerial fire departments will dash toward it will bedodome easier for the reason that hit modern skyzeraper is fact,
