





In the first four elections for president each elector voted for two candidates, the one receiving the largest number of votes was declared president and the one who received the next largest number of votes was declared vice president. At the election of 1804 a president and vice president were voted for separately and an amendment to the Constitution provided that the president and vice president could not be elected from the same state. To insure an election a candidate for president or vice president must have a majority of all the electoral votes cast, otherwise the election for president would be thrown into the house of representatives by states, each state having one vote, and for vice president into the senate,



BIG BUFFALO HUNT ON THE GOODNIGHT RANCH

Colonel Charles Goodnight, one of the central figures of pioneer Texas history and who has the only remaining herd of buffalo in the State, is planning a "Buffalo Barbecue" for a number of his early day pioneer friends. In order that the people generally, may have a glimpse of early day scenes, he has arranged to hring a band of Kiowa and Commanche Indians to his home and will get them to kill the buffalo in their aboriginal way. The hunt will be staged in the large ranch adjoining 1's home at Goodnight, and everylody will be permitted to see it. The herd of full-blood buffalo will be seen and one of the largest bisons will be killed. The indians are very anxious for the event to take place as this is possibly the last chance they will have to make old memories real again before they pass to the "happy hunting grounds" forever. This hunt will take place Friday afternoon October 6th at 2 o'clock and everybody is invited to be on hand. Trains on the Denver run so that people may come and leave the same day and get the full benefit of the hunt. Goodnight is on the Colorado-Gulf auto road and of easy access by automobiles from every direction. An informal program-will follow the "hunt," in which the visitors will be addressed by some of the old Texas pioneers and others.

Special invitations are out to the barbecue the next day, to which many of the prominent leaders of the state and a large number of pioneers have promised to come. Colonel Goodnight has spent 71 years of active life on the fronter land of Texas, and has been one of the most prominent figures in their upbuilding. He is a man of remarkable vitality and sound judgment and has always put himself on the side of moral and civic welfare. He is deeply interested in education and founded Goodnight College, in his home town, which is doing a splendid work for education. especially among boys and girls who have struggle and hardships of making their own way in the strictest economy. This was the actuating purpose in Colonel Goodnight's philanthropy in founding the school, to making it possible for such young people to get an education.

House Joint Resolution 30 Its Adoption Does Not Impose a Tax But Insures A Better School System


House Joint Resolution 30, passed by the Thirty-fourth Legislature, submits an amendment to the State Constitution to be voed on by he people at the general election to be held in November, 1916, providing that the Legislature may enact a law permitting common and independent schools districts to levy a local tox not to exceed one dollar on the one hundred dollars of assessed property valuation by a majority vote of the qualified property taxpaying voters of the district, and also permitting counties to levy a county school tax of fifty cents on the one hundred dollars of assessed property valuation to supplement the county school funds if a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of the county desire to do so.


The adoption of this amendment does not, therefore, impose a tax upon anyone, but simply removes the constitutional handicap which forbids many localities having efficient schools, and allows the people of school districts and counties where they desire to do so to provide adequate financial apport from their own funds for the proper maintenance of their own schools.
