

The United States can swallow all of Europe-area, population and all. The entire combined computed area of the foreign countries and the area of the western United States is very nearly the same, says Popular Science Monthly. The discrepancy is 15,000 square miles on Europe's side. At the same time, however, Russia in Europe would spread over the whole western part of our country, crowding it to the doors with its 111,000,000 of people, being the largest of all the European

The state of California has ample quarters for seven European countries, but its population is only a little over 2.000,000, whereas little Roumania alone harbors just about 7,000,000 in-

Austria-Hungary fits rather tightly across the shoulders in Texas, which has a scattered population of nearly 4.000,000, whereas Austria-Hungary has more than 51,000,000 of people accommodated within its boundaries.

More striking, however, is corpulent Idaho with its 325,000 inhabitants living in an area sufficient to quarter 16,000,-000 of Europeans living in four large countries. Then there are Montana and North Dakota with their 900,000 people enjoying enough room for Spain and Portugal's 25,000,000.




