failed to pass in all subjects this month than any previous month of the year There is one feature, however, that it seems to us ought to be im proved. I ref r to the great number of tardies each month. During December we had sixty tardies, and during the month just closed we had fortynine tardies. This number is far too large, but the habit of indifference to being punctual, that counts for so much in the life of the child, that causes this matter to give us concern. I have thought it advisable to suggest to your honorable body that it might be a good plan to give each room that has no absentees not tardies during the month a half holiday on the last day of the month. Even if each room in the school should earn this half holiday, it would be a good it vestment. I hope this suggistion may

meet your approval: " During the month, Mr. Thomas E. Fletcher, visitor of schools for the State University, visited our school and spent a half day with us. He vis ited several classes in the high school and in speaking to me about the work observed, expressed himself as being highly pleased with most of the work.

He told your super atendent that he considered the work in good condition, and thought you had a strong corps of teachers.

Recently the high schools of the state have been reclassified by the State Department of Education. 


