GUY C. HENSON DROWNED IN RIO GRANDE-IN ARMY

In the death of Guy C. Henson of P. M. JONES SPEAKS this city, the county suffers the first death among its soldier boys.

Guy Henson is the son of Judge A. N. Henson and has been in the service during the past six months, having volunteered when the first call was made after war was declared against Germany.

The particulars of his death are yet unknown here. A letter from him last week stated that the levies along the river were breaking and that the soldiers were fighting day and night to keep the water from the town of that his company was to leave for Ft. Worth the latter part of the week.

Sunday a message came from his Captain at Ft. Worth stating that he had been drowned and that the body was found in too bad a condition to be moved. It is evident that his death occurred before the company left Brownville and that the Captain was notified in Ft. Worth of the finding of the body.

The citizens of Canyon are grieved to hear of the death of Mr. Henson and extend their sympathy to Judge and Mrs. Henson in their sadness.







In Amarillo he showed only in the six months old class.




