



MILITARY TRAINING

West Texas State Normal College, Canyon, Texas

The following are the facts about Military Training as offered in this institution: Lieut. R. B. Wight, Military Inspector of Colleges for S. A. T. C. units, inspected the West Texas State Normal College Monday, September 23rd, and pronounced the institution A-1 for purposes of Military training. His report to the War Department was highly complimentary and he is recommending that the government very greatly enlarge its plans for using this institution for war service. He left with us the following instructions:

1. Boys may be housed in units of not less than twenty-five men.

Men will not be messed in groups of less than fifty.

3. There is no limit to the number of limited service men who may be admitted to the S. A.

4. All who registered September 12th, and who have as many as 12 1-2 high school units, or who can pass college entrance examinations, are entitled to enter.

5. Athletic sports are to be encouraged between teams within the unit, and teams of the unit with other convenient units.

6. Suggested Program:

Breakfast-6:30 a. m. Class-work-8:00-12:00 N. Mess-12:15 p. m. Class-work-1:00-2:00 p. m. Military Drill-2:30-4:30, four times per week. Inspection-Saturday morning. Supervised study at least one hour per day. Sleep-8 1-2 hours per day.

Boys who have finished a first-class high school will have no difficulty entering. Boys who have finished a second-class high school will have 11 of the 12 1-2 high school units and should prepare to take examination on 1 1-2 units September 30th at Canyon, Texas. Boys who have finished a third-class high school course will have 7 of the 12 1-2 units and may get into the S. A. T. C. only by making 5 1-2 units on examination. Holders of First Grade State Teachers' Certificates may enter by taking examination on 1 1-2 units.
