## Hawail Utilizes Volcanoes

Exchange: The volcanoes of Hawall
whether dead or alive, are working whether dead or alive, are working
for, or ate going to be made to work, for, or atre going
for the people.
Honolulu has just tapped the extinct
crater of Palola, overlooking the elty, and is getting therefrom $2,000,000 \mathrm{gal}$ the island of Hawaii, is ralsing a fund to tap the active volcano of Kileuea
and utilize the tremendous volume of gasses there for industrial and other
purposes. The cup-shaped tops of the extinct act as collection and storage reservoirs for immense amounts of water. A great deal of this has been seeping out through the sides of the former vol-
ano hills. Recently the Honolulu waer works department went prospectIng for new sources of supply, decided
to bore into the side of Palola crater and when the boring was completed obtained a rush of sparking waetr
that totaled $1,500,000$ gallons the first day and then jumped to $2,000,000$ gallons daily.
While Honolulu has been experimenting with water, ho fas the possibilty of fire as em bodied in the great overactive volcano Kilauea, thirty miles from that eity's door. Scientists declare that its pient-
up gases have limitless possibilities from an industrial and power stand food elements necessary to sustain the human body-carbon, nitrogen, hydogen and time.
Already $\$ 1,500$ has been subscribed to the funas for experiments at Kilaswelled to the $\$ 5,000$ necessary to do preliminary work.
