



Parent-Teachers' Ass'n **Oppose Games of** Chance in City

The Parent-Teachers' Association met at the Public School building Friday. Dec. 9. After a short literary program. Mrs. J. S. McReynolds read a helpful paper on co-operation between the school and the home. Then the question of how to win the confidence of the child was discussed by a large number of the mothers. The following resolutions were presented to the Association by a committee, and they were heartily approved of by all the members. These resolutions are being presented to the citizens of the town, and it is our hope that the merchants will help us carry out the requests made.

Since it is the chiefest desire that our children be protected from every evit and hindering influence, and since it is our duty to oppose all such influences, not only as individuals but also as united forces, we present to the people through the Parent-Teachers' Association the following facts and offer the resolution here attached:

1. The fact faces us that the tiniest child is able to secure cigarettes whenever he pleases through some older person who violates a well defined law against such sales or gifts.

2. The spirit of gambling has spread to every age of our boys and girls among the old and young and has been so little opposed that the child does not realize the harm and often enters into it without hesitancy.

3. It is commonly known that there are displayed in various places of business devices known as "punch boards" where children are allowed to take chances very much to their hurt moraliv and to their loss financially.

It is further known that hundreds of dollars have been wasted by the school-children of Canyon on these boards-(the money having been supplied by parents for the purchase of school supplies, lunches, etc).

4. That there are offered for sale at some of our business houses dice and playing cards which may be secured by our younger boys and which encourage the evil practice of gambling.

Be it resolved: That we request our merchants and friends to aid in every way the enforcement of the cigarette law.

2. That they be requested to remove the temptations offered by the "punch by discontinuing their use at once and refusing to keep in stock the articles complained of.

3. That these facts and resolutions be given publicity and be presented to our merchants for their endorsement.

PRESIDENT WRITES A LETTER

Mr. Harding's most obvious instance of adopting the methods which he and his supporters have spared no words heretofore to execrate and condemn has resulted in utter failure to get results. In sending a letter to Chairman Fordney of the House Ways and Means Committy attempting to direct the action of the House on a bill in conference Mr. Harding went to the extreme limit of anything ever charged up to his predecessor as "dictatorship," oneman rule or autocracy. In the practice itself there is little to be deplored. But if that is true now it was equally true during Mr. Harding's campaign for the presidency, a campaign which he based largely on the theory that the intermeddling of the executive with the legislative branch must be stopped.

Indeed, if the issues of that beclouded campaign be brought to view now it will be seen that for the most part they have by this time been either abandoned or made ridiculous. In place of the former abhorrence of internationalism we have now a conference dealing broadly with international affairs and with the prospect of at least a regional league or covenant for the maintenance of a sort of joint mandate over China. In place of the promise of the immediate passage of a stiff high-duty tariff bid, we have the admission that perhaps it would be better to wait until the situation clears up a In place of sweeping economies immediately to be instituted we have the same old deficiency appropriations and more promises, which may or may not be fulfilled.
