SECTION XIV: CHANGES AND AMENDMENTS. 1. Plans shall be drawn to scale and shall include a piot plan which shall disclose the actual dimensions of the lot upon which the proposed building is to be erected, the position of the proposed building upon the lot, its intended use, and such other information as the City Secretary may require for the proper enforcement of this Ordinance. It shall be the duty of the City forcement of this Ordinance. It shall be the duty of the City Secretary and such other officers of the City including the Building Inspector to check the plans and specifications carefully for compliance with the Building Code and with this Ordinance. In the event the plans and specifications and intended use do not comply with the terms of either the Zoning Ordinance.

Building Inspector and the City Secretary to deny the applica-tion for the building permit forthwith and to so endorse a refusal to issue some upon the SECTION XVI: ZONING MAP.

An official Zoning Map shall be kept, other than the one attached hereto, within the City Hall of Dimmitt, Texas, in
