

The strike was ended for more than 380,000 workers, most of them employed by the large basic steel producers. U. S. Steel, with 130,000 workers; Bethlehem, with 75,000; Republic, with 38,700; and Youngstown Sheet and Tube, with 20,000 were among the companies resuming under new agreements with the union providing for an 181/2 cents an hour wage increase. Meanwhile, one of the few basic steel plants in the nation unaf-fected by the walkout, the Weirton Steel Company, with 10,000 workers at Weirton, W. Va., and Steubenville, O., announced a 22 cents an hour increase for hourly, piece-work and tonnage employes.

The company has no contract with the CIO, but recognizes the Weirton Independent Union, Inc., as its collective bargaining agent.

Suspect Arrested In Fatal Shooting Of Strike Breaker



We Are Unprepared

A Congressional committee has devoted a lot of time to an investigation of this country's unpreparedness at the time of Pearl Harbor. That is all well and good. But it seems pertinent to suggest that there is a more urgent need for serious attention to the matter of this country's unpreparedness in February, 1946.

We are unprepared for war or peace. We are unprepared to play fully our natural part as a leader among nations. Our foreign policy is neither very clear nor very forceful. Our rapid demobilization of the world's greatest army and navy betrays a lack of determination or serious intention to back up that policy as it exists today.

We are unprepared for orderly progress toward the goal of full production and full employment. The greatest industrial country in the world is a country dotted with idle factories whose idleness is reflected in empty showrooms and empty store shelves. The most prosperous country in the world cannot house thousands of the veterans of the world's greatest army who are pouring in from the recent battle fronts.

A clash of economic philosophies within the President's inner circle added turbulence to the existing turmoil over price control. The President himself, unable to offer and enforce workable solutions, has been ignored, insulted and harangued by various self-interested groups.

We do not look very convincing today in the role of the world's greatest nation. Fortunately, there is no immediate likelihood to war. But what would happen if there should be a sudden international crisis which demanded swift and strong action? Could we meet it, or should we suffer a sort of spiritual Pearl Harbor?

We are unprepared because we lack national unity. It may not be unusual or even unhealthy that Americans disagree on every vital issue today—the United Nations Organization, atomic energy control, Russia, loans to Britain, administration policies, Congressional action, industrial disputes, and more. But it is discouraging to contemplate the indifference toward these issues that seems to possess so many of us.

Our sufferings, compared with those of our Allies, are insignificant. Yet Britain and Russia, at least, know what they want and where they are going and are pursuing their course in spite of wartime disruptions. They may be going in the wrong direction, but we seem incapable at the moment of turning them toward the way of world peace and general betterment.

We united and prepared for war. We must unite and prepare now for world leadership and world preservation.
That victory will be no less difficult, nor will it require any less community of effort.

Wyatt's Housing Plan

If Housing Expediter Wilson Wyatt's plan to build Bill Davidson Is 3,000,000 low-cost houses in the next two years is given the go-ahead by Congress, it will mean a complete revolution in the real estate and construction business.

These industries are now encumbered with more antiquated trade practices, building codes and labor restrictions than the wreck of the Hesperus has barnacles.

Most controversial item on the Wyatt program is probably his "Production Premium Payment" idea. Call it the "PPP" plan for short. The ugly name for it is "Housing Subsidy." Wyatt says he isn't ducking the nasty word "subsidy" on purpose but he thinks "Production Premium Payment" more accurately describes what he is shooting at. He offers it as an incentive plan to get more huilding materials produced so more houses can be "two prince water" was Rleck Bluer. more building materials produced so more houses can be

Principal building materials in short supply are brick, lumber, cast-iron radiators and soil pipe, gypsum and lath.

The murky floodwater was a foot deep in the house when it was sold. Production premium payments might be applied to any or all of them. Wyatt now isn't saying which will need most

Take gypsum as an example. To meet Wyatt's housing goals, gypsum production for plaster board and lath will have to be stepped up at least a third this year and two thirds next year.

In applying production premium payments to get more gypsum rock mined in Nova Scotia and various parts of the United States, first step would be the determination of a base year in which production was normal and average. Say that year were 1941.

If an outright subsidy were paid to encourage production, it would be paid on every ton of gypsum rock mined or every pound processed. Under the Production Premium Payment plan, however, no subsidy would be paid on the output up to the 1941 levels. Premiums would be paid only on production above the 1941 levels, providing an incentive for the extra production.

This extra production is going to be obtained only by increasing the capacity of the industry.
