MacArthur Appoints War Crimes Tribunal

TOKYO—(AP)—General MacArthur Monday announced the appointment of the nine members of the International War Crimes Tribunal, with Sir William Flood Webb of Australia as president.
 The others are Justice Stuart Mac Dougall of Canada; Judge Ao Mei of China; Henry Reimburger, France; Prof. Bernard Victor A. Roling, the Netherlands; Justice Harvey Northcroft, New Zealand; Justice I. M. Zaryanov, Russia; Lord Patrick, United Kingdom, and Justice John P. Higgins of the United States. The justices were nominated by signatory powers.

Dallas Banker Predicts 12 Per Cent Price Hike

DALLAS—(AP)—An increase in prices of from 12 to 15 per cent this year and reaching 22 per cent above present levels in 1947 was forecast by B. W. Wooten, vice president of the Dallas Republic National Bank.
 Speaking at the dinner Monday night which closed a marketing conference attended by merchandisers from Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Missouri and Colorado, he said:
 "The increase in prices is based on an average wage increase of 18 1/2 per cent. Business can absorb about five per cent of that increase, and the rest will go into prices."

Standard Golf Ball Designated For National

CLEVELAND—(AP)—The United States Golf Association will designate a standardized ball, to assure fair competition in the National Open at Canterbury Golf Club here in June, E. G. K. Meister, general chairman for the tournament, said.
 During the Texas Open in San Antonio, Jimmy Demaret filed a protest with Ed Dudley, president of the PGA, noting that he, Demaret, just out of service, had to play with the synthetic golf ball while competing against others who still had a supply of prewar balls and were using them in the same tournament.

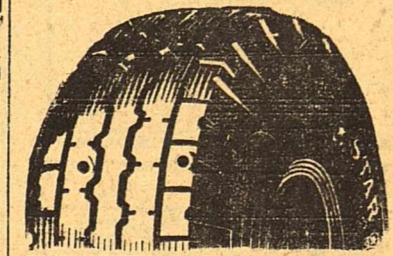
MackENZIE'S COLUMN

HERFORD, BRITISH OCCUPATION ZONE IN GERMANY—(AP)—If there are any who doubt the necessity of a protracted Allied occupation of the Reich they will find confirmation of the need written on the faces of the German people.
 If restraint were removed from them now, the old arrogance and militaristic aggression would return in time. You get that from the glances of cold hatred or the looks of disdain which many of the grownups give an Allied uniform.
 For the most part the youngsters are friendly enough. But many—though not all—of their elders have a very understandable aversion to their conquerors.
 I don't want to convey the impression that the Germans are eager to renew their assault on the rest of the world, for they definitely are not.
 The point is that if the Allies don't take advantage of this temporarily chastened frame of mind by keeping the lid on and trying to create peace-mindedness among the coming generation, then the efforts on the battle fields will have been lost. That's where the friendliness of the youngsters come in.
Children Are Only Hope
 The elderly folk are passing out of the picture. The still youthful Germans who were won over by Hitler are lost to the Allies. It is upon the children that peace must be built.
 There's another interesting and important feature that you note in this zone which includes not only great agricultural areas but the coal mines and industries of the Ruhr. Under the progressive administration which Field Marshal Montgomery established in the British zone the Germans are jumping in and working like troopers to repair the ravages of war.
 In the Ruhr many mines are partly in operation producing coal for which all Western Europe is waiting anxiously and in the devastated cities and towns the people are salvaging bricks and reconstructing abodes of sorts—frequently very crude.
 The Germans are the same hard working, systematic and persistent folk upon whom the Prussian militarists and finally Hitler have depended for strength to carry out their schemes for conquest.
 That is an energy which must be guided into the right channels and held there until a new generation of peace-minded Germans can be reared.

Chemist Says Plastics Industry To Help Texas

AUSTIN—(AP)—Chemical Engineer William P. Schambra of Freeport predicts the growing demand for plastics will greatly increase the importance of the Texas Gulf Coast as a source of chemical raw materials.
 Schambra, superintendent of the Chemical Engineering Division of the Dow Chemical Company at Freeport, said practically unlimited quantities of the major raw materials that go into the manufacture of plastics are to be found on the Gulf Coast.
 He said the growth of the plastics industry will bring Texas plants into the industrial picture as never before. Schambra spoke here before a meeting of Central Texas Members of the American Chemical Society and Sigma Xi, honorary graduate science organization.

McKENNEY ON BRIDGE

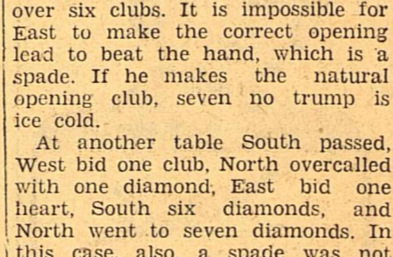

A freak hand can start a lot of discussion. Here is one that came up at the Cavendish Club in New York. Most of the "South" players opened the bidding with four diamonds, but from there on unusual variations took place.

At one table, West bid six clubs. What would you do with the North holding, bid six diamonds, or double six clubs?

The most unusual result was obtained when North bid six no trump over six clubs. It is impossible for East to make the correct opening lead to beat the hand, which is a spade. If he makes the natural opening club, seven no trump is ice cold.

At another table South passed, West bid one club, North overcalled with one diamond, East bid one heart, South six diamonds, and North went to seven diamonds. In this case, also, a spade was not opened and seven was made.

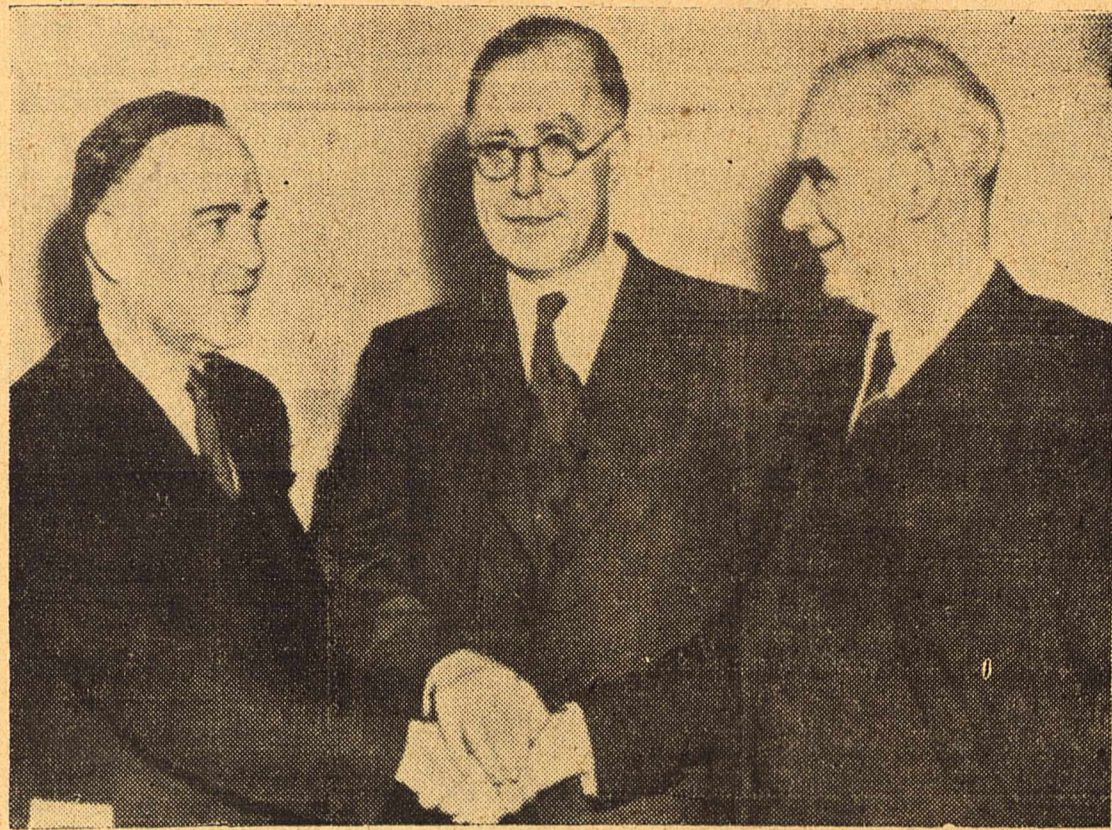
Wife Of Acting Ickes Successor From South
