# GI Who Heard Japs Testifies Pontiff Tells Chape

## Picked Up Jap Planes Hour Before Raid

An ex-GI told Wednesday how he discovered Japanese planes sneaking up to attack Pearl Harbor Dec. 7, 1941, and how a superior officer advised him and his buddy to "forget it."

The account was related to the

Senate-House Inquiry Committee by George A. Elliott, one-time buck private who detected the enemy planes on a radar set almost an hour before the bombs fell on the Pacific Fleet base.

Elliott, 28, of Long Branch, N. J. left the Army as a sergeant four

On the morning of the attack he and another private, Joseph Lock-ard, were alone at the mobile radar station in the northernmost tip of the Island of Oahu.

Elliott said that at 7:02 a. m their radar scope picked up a large flight of planes 136 or 137 miles away three degrees east of north. He said that within seven or eight minutes of plotting he tried raise the aircraft warning center by a direct telephone but got no







Firm Asks Permission To Increase Capacity Of Gas Line To W. Va.

HOUSTON-(AP)- The Tennessee Gas and Transmission Company has filed an application with the Federal Power Commission to increase the capacity of its 24-inch natural pipe line from Texas to West Virginia by 40 per cent. Three-fourth of the increase is expected to be for the transmission of waste gas.

The company said it planned to spend \$29,500,000 in increasing the line's capacity from 264,000,000 cubic feet daily to 381,000,000 cubic feet. Work would start May 1.

In its application the company said that there had been an unsigned to prepare for increased de- precedented demand for domestic mands for electricity that are ex- gas in the Appalachian area this winter and that it had received application for service from systems supplying small communities along the line. It is anticipated that agreements will be made to supply gas to these communities.

The company is now negotiating for casinghead gas from the Seelingson, Tom O'Connor, Heyser and Katy fields, it said. Waste gas production there is reported to be 87,000,000 cubic feet daily.
