Rotarians Give \$2,600 To Hospital Fund

Fund Will Be Memorial To Dr. W. E. Ryan

Midland Rotarians, at their meeting Thursday noon in the Scharbauer Hotel, contributed \$2,600 to the Midland Memorial Hospital and voted unanimously that the fund should be used as a memorial to the late Lt. Col. W. E. (Bill) Ryan, Midland physician and surgeon who was killed in France during World War II. Colonel Ryan, a charter member

and past president of the club, was executive officer of the largest tent hospital with the American forces in France when he was killed in an automobile accident.

To complete the fund, the club

voted to take available money from the club's treasury, and Rotarians added to the sum until the \$2,600 total was reported. R. L. Miller, head of the club's

hospital committee, outlined the program and discussed the need for the hospital. W. I. Pratt offered the motion to use the fund as a memorial to Dr. Ryan and it was adopted unanimously.

Serious And Disturbing

This month's Woman's Home Companion prints the results of its latest reader poll under the heading, "Serious and Disturbing." Two thousand women of various ages and income groups throughout the country were asked whether they felt that we are on the road to permanent peace. Only one in six answered yes.

They also were asked whom they thought we would fight against, if peace could not be preserved. Of the two-thirds who answered specifically, 65 per cent named

Serious and disturbing these findings certainly are. But they are neither shocking nor surprising. A streetcorner sampling of opinion by anyone in any town might well yield the same results. Why?

The magazine's editors try to answer that in an editorial accompanying the poll results. They also try to calm fears and encourage straight thinking. There is wisdom in what they have said. But what they say was written before Premier Stalin's recent "campaign" speech, and it is addressed not to Stalin, but to the American

They lay much of the war fear to "the fanatical Russia-haters and the professional Russia-baiters." They point out that Russia has never made an aggressive move oward us, that there is plenty of room in the world for the Russian and American systems, that America and Russia have nothing to fear from each other. "What on earth," they ask, "should we fight about?"

All of this might have been true and easy to write at the time. Much of it remains logical. But Premier Stalin's speech has changed the complexion of the whole subject.

He talked, as Hitler used to talk, of "encirclement." (Hitler was encircled by "democracies;" Stalin by "captalism.") Stalin talked of building up a huge heavyindustry capacity "to guarantee the country against any eventuality," as Hitler used to talk about "bullets before

Gone was the fine wartime talk about the alliance of democratic, freedom-loving people against the Hitlerite enemy. Premier Stalin now blames both world wars on

Most Americans didn't believe Hitler until it was too They laughed at him. No one laughs at Joseph Stalin. No one can dismiss his speech as idle political oratory. Russia doesn't operate that way.

It seems clear at last that what is "serious and disturbing" is not American pessimism and cynicism concerning permanent peace, but the cause of the American attitude. When the cause is removed, the attitude will change. Until then, this country must be realistic as well as pessimistic. It must work for peace, but it must also be prepared to defend it, and defend it strongly and swiftly against the threat of another total war that promises total destruction.

Departure Of A Curmudgeon

Things will be quieter in Washington without Harold L. Ickes. Also duller. The temperamental, tempestuous, self-styled and self-made curmudgeon hung up a number of records during his stay in the capital, most of them unofficial.

One of them, so far as we know, is 13 consecutive years in the same cabinet post. Also, in his various capacities as secretary of the interior, he must have set some sort of job-holding mark in our towering bureaucracy. Ickes had more titles than the Emperor Haile Selassieand he worked at a lot of them, too. And somehow, with all this, he managed to write more and longer letters than almost anyone in public life, of which output his letter of resignation is a fair sample.

Ickes lent a good deal of zip, if not glamour, to the somewhat unspectacular job of heading the Interior Department. By vituperative word and vehement action he made a lot of enemies, especially around election time. But he will undoubtedly be remembered as having done an honest and efficient job.



Workers Over 65 Should File Claim Promptly To Board

The Social Seccrity Board is of-fer ng its full cooperation to workers and former workers who have reached the age of 65 in an effort to help them avoid any loss of bene-fits through delay in filing claims, it was announced Thursday by Elliott W. Adams, manager of the board's office at San Angelo, and who serves Midland.

"Any person who has worked enough in private industry and commerce to be insured under the old-age and survivors insurance program can file a claim at age 65 to peg his benefits at a point below which they cannot fall, Adams said. Then, if he keeps on working, or if he gets a new job, and his wage record would produce higher benefits at a later date, he may file a request to have his benefit recalculated to give him the higher rate. Protects Benefit Rights

Adams pointed out that his office has been urging workers for some time to confer with the Social Security Board officials upon reaching age 65, in order to protect full bene-

"A great many workers have done just that," Adams said, "but many have not. They have been under the impression that once a claim be filed, the benefit could not be changed even though subsequent work might produce a higher poten-tial benefit figure. "That was true for a time, but

last year the board inaugurated a method of recalculation which will keep benefits from going down, once a claim is filed, but will not keep them going up. If workers and former workers in private industry and commerce, who have passed the age of 65, will just come in to see us, we will give them the information and help necessary to protect their full benefit rights."



If you are not familier with the hand, it would seem unbelievable that South, with all his high cards, could not take a trick. You can have some fun with your friends if you prepare this hand and watch how they oid and play it. West, who per-



sists in overcalling South's bids, is finally pushed to seven spades which South eagerly doubles.

You can see that, regardless of North's opening, West is going to make a grand slam. If a heart or elub is opened, declarer ruffs it ruffs a diamond in dummy, which drops the king, then finesses the ten of spades. Another diamond is ruffed in dummy, dropping the ace, the queen of spades is finessed, and the ace picks up the last trump. Then declarer's hand is solid. This is the best known of all freak hands ever played in bridge.

Blend Of Brahma, Hereford, Durham Entered In Show

EL PASO-A rare species of cattle, the Brahma blended breed, has been entered in the Southwestern Livestock Show, it was announced Thursday by E. Jay Dittmer, generâl manager. The Brahma blended breen is half Brahma, quarter Durham and quarter Hereford. The animal is characterized chiefly by its rapid increase in weight. Another characteristic is its color, which is of a crazy-quilt variety.

John H. Laxson, of Van Horn, Texas, is the exhibitor. He is a newcomer in the Southwest, and he is trying to interest Southwestern ranchers in this breed.

The Southwestern Livestock Show will open March 26 in the Coliseum buildings in El Paso and continue through March 31. About 2,000 entries are expected, and total premiums have ben increased to about \$12,000. Last year there were 704

entries, with \$2,200 in premiums. The Southwestern Livestock Show comes of age this year. For the first time, national cattle breeding organizations will participate, and space is being provided for 540 major beef breed exhibits. George will be superintendent of the breeding cattle divisions.

About 400 entries are expected in the junior divisions, which will comprise fat calves, breeding sheep, fat lambs and swine. Members of the Future Farmers of America and 4-H Clubs from all over the Southwest will participate. A feature of the junior division will be the immediate payment of premiums after the judging. J. W. "Tex" Condon of Los Angeles will be the auctioneer at the sale of 4-H and FFA prizewinning animals.

In addition there will be exhibits of registered quarter horses, palominos, rabbits and poultry. The Southwestern Championship Rodeo will be held in conjunction with the livestock show.

Raisin Turnovers Improve Party



Raisin turnovers . . . for winter parties.

By GAYNOR MADDOX NEA Staff Writer For a party of ten, here's a particularly welcome dessert with a wonderful sauce.

Raisin Turnovers

(Makes 10 turnovers) Two cups seedless raisins, 2 cups water, 1/3 cup firmiy packed brown sugar, 2 tablespoons cornstarch, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon vinegar, 1 tablespoon butter, 2 1/2 cups sifted cake flour, 1/2 to 1 teaspoon salt, 2/3 cup cold shortening, 1/3 cup cold

Combine raisins and water in saucepan. Boil for 5 minutes. Mix together brown sugar, cornstarch, cinnamon and salt. Add to raisins and continue cooking until mixture becomes clear. Remove from heat. Add vinegar and butter. Cool. Sift flour once, measure, add salt and sift again. Cut in shortening until pieces are about the size of small

Add water, a small amount at a time, mixing lightly with fork. Turn out on lightly floured board,

roll 1/8-inch thick, and cut into 6-inch circles or 5-inch squares. Moisten edges with cold water. Place about 4 tablespoons filling on one side of each circle or square, fold over, and seal edges with floured fork. Brush lightly with cream, if desired. With sharp knife, make slits in top of each turnover to permit escape of steam. Bake in SIGNS ON CAR READ: 'JUST hot oven (425 degrees F.) about 20 DIVORCED' AND 'MAN WANTED' minutes. Serve with following egg nog sauce.

Egg Nog Sauce (Makes about 2 cups sauce) Three tablespoons sugar, 1 tablespoon flour, dash salt, 1 egg separated, 1 1/4 cups milk, 1/8 teaspron nutmeg, 1 tablespoon rum c. 1/4 teaspoon rum extract.

Combine 2 tablespoons sugar, flour and salt in double boiler. Add egg yolk and beat well. Then add milk slowly, stirring constantly. Cook 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat. Cool. Add nutmeg, rum or rum extract. Beat egg white until foamy. Add 1 tablespoon sugar gradually, beating constantly until mixture will stand in soft peaks. Fold in custard mixture.
