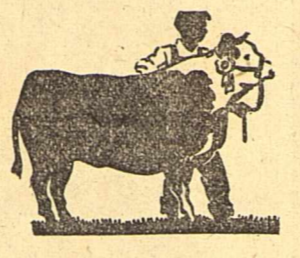

Midland school children will have a holiday during the absence of the teachers.

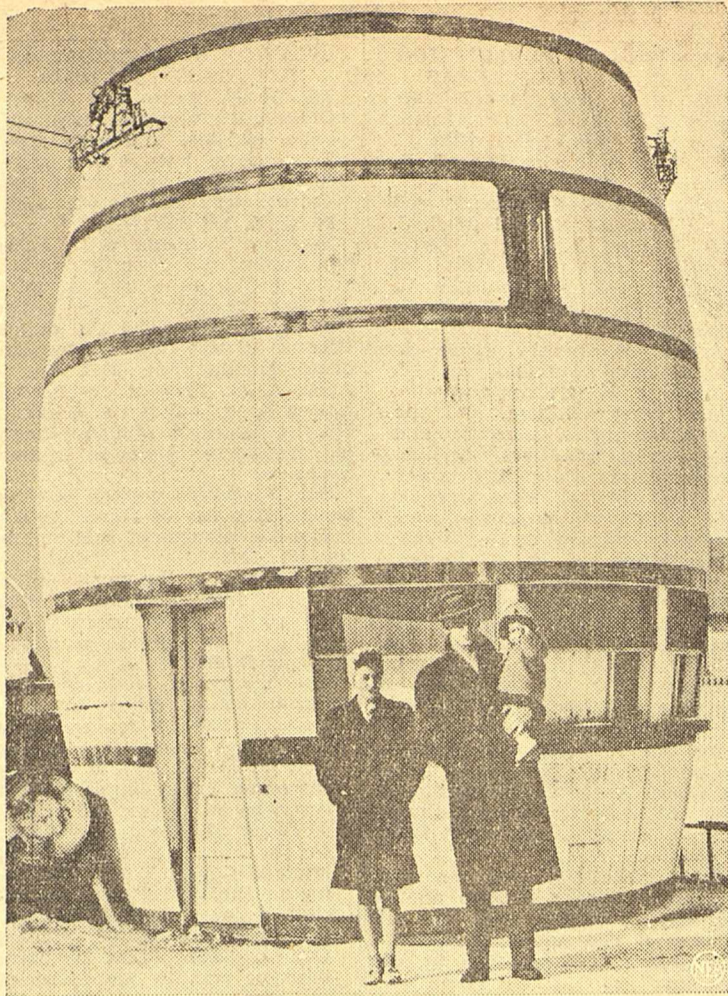

"No. They only gave me a street car ticket."



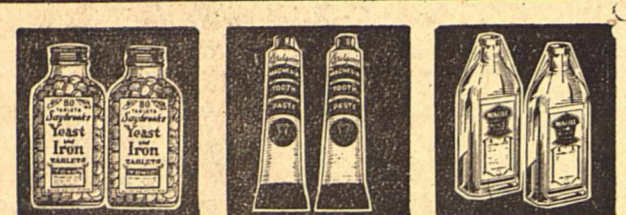
