Russia Loses* Fight To Drop Iranian Issue

ward R. Stettinius, Jr., U. S. delegate to the United Nations Security Council, was reliably reported Wednesday to have indicated he would support the Australian proposal for a thorough investigation of Franco Spain.

This word came as the council took a one-day recess after Tues-day's stormy session in which Soviet Russia lost her battle to have the council drop the Iranian case and announced she would boycott any further discussion of the case.

Sir Alexander Cadogan, British delegate, also was reported to have received instructions to back the Australian proposal. Mexico and Poland previously had indicated they would support the measure and it was believed Russia and France were ready to go along.

The other delegates, while re-

luctant to commit themselves in advance, were expected to follow the lead of the big powers, which for once seemed to be in agreement. It thus appeared that the Spanish question was finally headed toward a harmonious solution when the council meets at 2 p. m. (CST)

Such action would avert a showdown on Poland's move for a worldwide diplomatic break with the Franco regime for at least four weeks-the time allotted for the inquiry by a five-man committee. Gromyko Fights To End

Soviet Delegate Andrei A. Gromyko fought to the last to push through his resolution to strike the Iranian case from the council's agenda, but in the end he recognized his defeat by associating himself Tuesday with a milder resolu-tion offered by French Delegate Henri Bonnet.

The French proposal provided that the case be dropped from the agenda but it had an additional provision that the secretary-general report to the general assembly on any new developments on the Iran-

ian question. Bonnet's resolution, however, was three of the council's 11 votes. It was supported only by Russia and Poland. All the other delegates during the debate had expressed a desire to keep the case on the agenda until May 6, the date on The action came as the case. which Russia has promised to have all her troops out of Iran.



Record Wheat And Corn Thomason Files Crops For Nation Are

WASHINGTON -(A)- Undersecretary of Agriculture N. E. Dodd has reported there is a "good chance" that this year's wheat and corn crops will be the largest in the country's history.

Dodd based this optimistic prediction on reports he has received in recent weeks from all parts of the country.

He said the early spring season had enabled farmers to get a fine start. officials have said the United States and other major grain producing countries must produce bumper crops this year if

current famine conditions in wartorn areas are to be averted next Dodd told an interviewer he felt confident farmers will plant nearly

300,000,000 acres of food, livestock feed, and fiber crops. This would be nearly 4,000,000 more than were planted last year when the country till was at war. Contrary to the belief he said

some Americans hold, Dodd asserted that the government is imposing no restrictions on production, except in the case of tobacco. Growers of some types of tobacco have voted, he said, to have the government reketing quotas.

"We are not paying out a cent to farmers for producing less," he

He added that programs now being operated by the AAA-once a curtailment agency-are designed to encourage greater production than to discourage it.

Present AAA programs involve trict. the distribution of about \$270,000,000 a year to farmers who follow soil and water conservation practices recommended by the agency.

United Nations House Hunt

The solemn, history-making sessions of the United Nations seem destined to continue in the same incongruous settings that have formed the backdrop for its deliberations ever since it chose the United States as a permanent home. First it was an opera house, then a girls' gymnasium. And now the organization is to divide its activities between a gyroscope factory and a skating rink on a deserted fairgrounds.

Of course, the UN has run into the same housing shortage that afflicts anyone wanting to make a change of residence or business address today. But the final decision on a temporary home (which may have to do for two to five years) seems an unhappy one.

To get over the least important objection first, there is a symbolism attached to the chosen buildings which provokes a rather ominous snicker unbecoming to the seriousness of the UN's task. The dizzy whirl of the gyroscope and the slips, slides, and spills that go with skating are bound to crop up and bedevil men's minds In Hollywood Home with unfortunate similes whenever the deliberations show signs of getting out of hand.

But there are practical considerations, too. The two buildings are nine miles apart. The Sperry plant, where the council and secretariat will hold forth, is 22 miles from midtown Manhattan, where the delegates make their headquarters. The old City of New York building, left over his time from the World's Fair, is seven miles distant from mid-

Transportation to the Sperry plant will involve a lot of changes for those members of the organization who don't have cars-and it's a sure thing that not all the clerical staff is so blessed. In addition, the surroundings of the two sites seem somewhat less than inspiring,

In contrast to these disadvantages, there is an alternate choice of a temporary or even permanent home for the UN which at least offers some physical inducements. That is the Pentagon Building in Washington.

Ever since this mammoth structure was built, people have been wondering what would happen after the war to this building which at one time housed 30,000 military and civilian workers. A logical solution might be to turn

The Pentagon isn't beautiful, but it is commodious. There are shops and restaurants and some rather flossy office-suites already installed, as well as hundreds of unglamorous but efficient workrooms. It could probably be remodeled to suit UN needs as easily as the skating rink or the gyroscope factory. No doubt it would even be possible to convert some of the space into dwelling units, if the housing shortage still warranted such a move.

The building is close to downtown Washington. There is quick bus service and ample parking space. And surely our peacetime Army would have ample room in the several other buildings in the capital which it used during

Probably the Pentagon has been considered and rejected. It may be felt that it is too close to the seat and influence of the American government—though with New York immediately accessible by telephone and only about an hour away by air, that would seem a rather secondary consideration.

At any rate, the UN officials have made their choice. But we still think they have passed up a good bet.

Outdoor Thinking

As good news as we have heard in some time is the word that Bernard M. Baruch is once again doing some thinking on a park bench. The scene and subject have changed, since Baruch is now tackling the problem of world control of atomic energy in New York's Central Park. But the technique remains the same.

The country is indebted to Baruch for a lot of constructive thinking carried on in similar surroundings. In Lafayette Park, across from the White House, he pondered the manpower, rubber, and aircraft shortages, and the reconversion problem, and achieved some excellent results—even though his advice wasn't always followed.

Baruch isn't the first man who has done good constructive thinking out-of-doors. Socrates, for one, is reputed to have performed right nobly in the open air.

But of late centuries we have come more and more to confine our thinking within the four walls of office or study, and at the same time to abuse our reason with outdoor orators, from Hitler and Mussolini down to the more modest soap-box haranguers. Maybe that's one thing that is wrong. At least, Baruch can make a good case for it.



U. S. Sailor Kills Nine Mates, Then Stabs Himself

SHANGHAI -(P) A 19-year-old seaman killed nine shipmates and wounded a tenth in a berserk blaze of gunfire aboard an LST in the Yangtze River Tuesday, then stab-

The Navy announced that the sailor was L. B. Smith, seaman second class of Asheville, N. C.

The orgy of shooting and stabbings ended, the Navy said, when Smith was disarmed by an un-named sailor, himself mortally wounded, and was floored by metal bench wielded by Kenneth M. Stalnecker, .18, seaman second class of Reading, Pa.
Brought to the Navy hospital ship

Repose in Shanghai Harbor, Smith was given a 50-50 chance to survive three deep gashes in the upper abdomen inflicted with his own

Smith, described as a quiet, introspective youth, stood a 10 p. m. to midnight watch as gangway messenger, then obtained a carbine from the cabin of the gunnery officer, who was away on watch, the Navy said. He also had a pistol which had been concealed among his own effects.

About 3 a. m. he entered the sleeping compartment of the LST, where 30 shipmates were asleep. Switching on the lights, he opened fire. Seven seamen were killed outright and two others died later of their wounds.

When his ammunition was exhausted, he leaped upon his victims with a knife.

Stalnecker, who escaped the bullets, and the mortally wounded sailor leaped from their bunks. Despite their wounds, the unnamed sailor reached Smith first. But before he could disarm Smith, the young sailor plunged the knife into his own body. Stalnecker then knocked Smith down with the metal
