

PARIS -(A)- The Big Four foreign ministers met again Friday afternoon to seek agreements on European peace treaties amid reports that Russia would block an American effort to secure discussion of the Austrian situation, but an American informant confirmed a report the Russians had raised no objection to discussion of French demands for detachment of the Ruhr and Rhine-

A source in conference circles said that the Russians told the foreign ministers of the United States, Great Britain and France Thursday that they realized the seriousness of the Austrian situation and felt it needed careful study before being discussed and that they did not believe such a study could be completed in time for discussion at the present confer-

Final action on the long-pending

compact would pave the way for an international oil conference. Officials who disclosed the Administration decision privately said the need for speedy action has been enhanced both by British anxiety

over the delay and by Russia's entrance into the petroleum field outside her own borders through the recently - concluded 50-year agreement with Iran. The Anglo-American pact was

through the Midland Chamber of signed in London last September 24 by Harold Ickes, then secretary of the interior, and Emanuel Shinwell, Britain's minister of fuel. A basic clause provides that adequate petroleum shall be made available to all countries 'on a competitive and non-discriminatory basis."

Another clause in the agreemen laces both Britain and the United States on record as favoring "as soon as practicable" the negotiation of a petroleum agreement beween all interested producing and onsuming countries.

Prior to the Soviet-Iran pact, Britain and the United States were the chief holders of petroleum inerests outside their borders. Russia's arrangements with Iran and her economic alliances in the petroleum-rich Balkans now, however, make her a vital factor in the overall international oil situation







Dangerous One-Way Streets

The victorious wartime alliance against the Axis has or parts thereof: shown definite symptoms of breaking up ever since hostilities ceased. These symptoms are still present. And while they are distressing, they are not unnatural.

It has long been the practice of nations, especially the strong ones, to go their own way when it seemed expedient to do so. A sort of private enterprise system among nations has always been popular, whatever the shade of a nation's domestic politics. Jealous guardianship of sovereignty, prestige, and prerogatives has been emphasized at the expense of efforts for the common good.

The United Nations, like the League of Nations before it, is trying to break these old habits. It isn't an easy job. But it is made easier by two rather unrelated and intangible factors. One is the lingering memory of the efficacy of sticking together in the face of common peril, which the war so pointedly emphasized. The other is the been having of late.

A good example of the latter, of course, is the Russo-Iranian dispute. Russia started it off with a unilateral violation of a three-power agreement to get foreign troops out of Iran on a given date. Russia then tried a rather dramatic unilateral opposition to the UN Security Council's decision, with her representative leaving the council's sessions when his government's wishes were denied.

Further, Russia exhibited the traditionally touchy national pride when her representative asked that the Iranian matter be removed from the council's agenda.

In each instance, collective action prevailed, though not triumphantly. And Russia, despite an impressive performance, failed to win her points completely with her 'master strokes.

An equally good example has been our stumbling policy toward Argentina. Our opposition to the pro-Axis clique has been sound, but our technique has been bad. The State Department has gone its own way in all directions, appeasing and denouncing, attacking and with-

Our government went its own way without consulting | Marines. its Pan-American neighbors. Being incomparably stronger than other Western Hemisphere nations, it was vulnerable to suspicions of "Yankee imperialism." Lacking Pan-American support, it succeeded only in arousing a united feeling of national pride in Argentina, and thus helping Colonel Peron toward the presidency.

There still remains considerable danger of unilateral strife within the United Nations; of opposition for opposition's sake between Russia on the one hand and an Anglo-American team on the other. But if the unhappy consequences of such actions continue to be forthcoming, they should help the world's nations along their painful journey toward unity for the world's salvation.

The common peril remains. So does the war's lesson hood when he spent many a night of how it was averted. Most nations, like most of their around a tobacco-curing barn, just inhabitants, learn slowly and with difficulty. But there are hopeful signs that they are learning.

Wasted Food In A Hungry World

At this time of acute food shortages, it is disturbing to read that an estimated 25 per cent of fresh fruits and vegetables grown in this country each year is lost through waste and spoilage. That means, in effect, that one of every four acres devoted to those products is never really used, and that two out of every eight hours which the farmer devotes to them are wasted.

Dr. Charles W. Hauck of Ohio State University has concluded that this lost food would supply the normal fruit and vegetable needs of Belgium, Holland, Czechoslovakia, and Greece. He has further concluded that the excuses generally given for this loss-inevitably due to the perishable nature of the product or the thoughtlessness of a well-fed nation—aren't necessarily valid.

Dr. Hauck calls attention to experiments now being carried on in Columbus, O., by retail stores and several suppliers. Losses have been cut by packaging the food in consumer-size units at the farm and shipping it in improved containers. They have been cut further by consumer packaging and refrigeration in the stores. In the near future, air transport of highly perishable items and a hoped-for speeding up of other transportation will cut the losses even further.

Certainly, these experiments should be continued and their effective results made widely available. And, just as certainly, careless waste in our own kitchens should and can be combatted immediately. In a hungry world it is no less than a moral responsibility to use food wisely and carefully.
