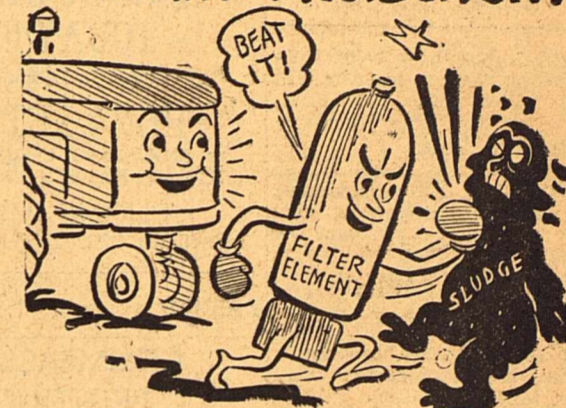

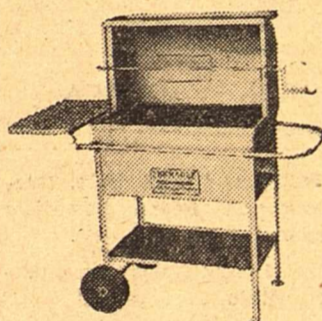

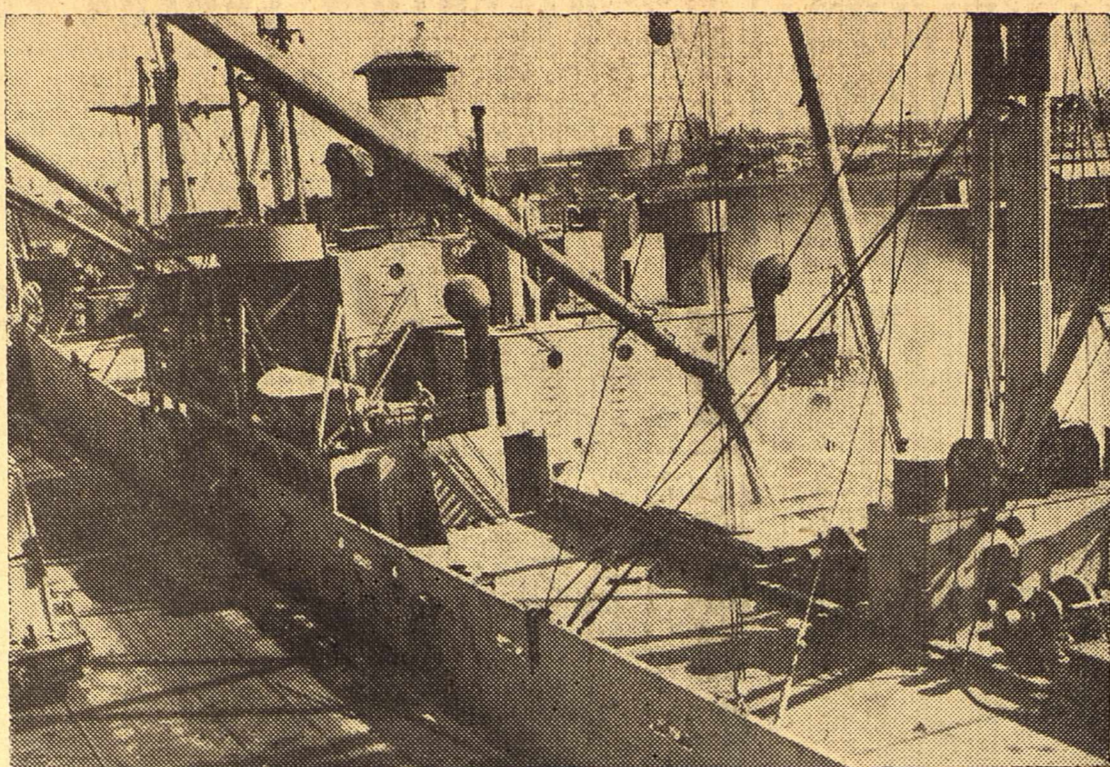

Out Of Fox-Holes Into Footlights, 20 GIs Go To School For Theater

By MARIANNE FACHNER CLEVELAND.—(NEA)—"All together now," the man at the piano said. "La le li lu. Up and down the scale. Remember to take a deep breath before you hit the high ones."

And 20 veterans of World War II—men who have seen active battle service from the hedge-rows of France to the mountains of Burma...

This was the Monday morning lesson in speech placement for the apprentice students of The Cleveland Playhouse. It was serious business for men who are taking advantage of the GI Bill of Rights to train for the theater as a profession.

The Cleveland Playhouse, a unique community-type theater, is the outstanding one of three full-time, practicing theater organizations on the country to be accredited by the government for veteran training.

Class lessons in speech, acting, makeup, shop, fencing, costume-design, body-work are supplemental.

The Playhouse has never charged its students tuition, and the government supplies merely a subsistence allowance to the veterans who have come to find a career in the theater by a variety of routes.

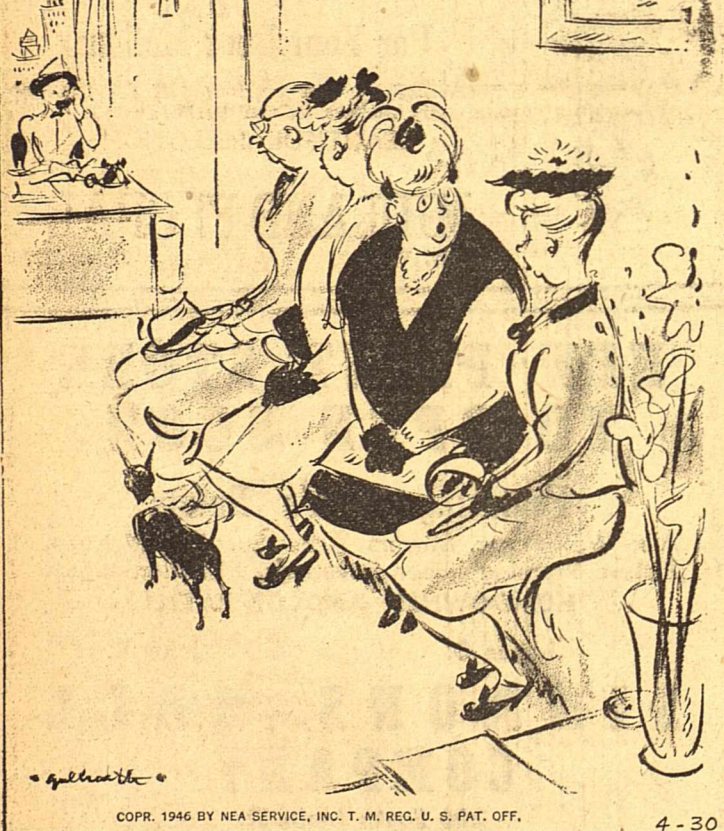

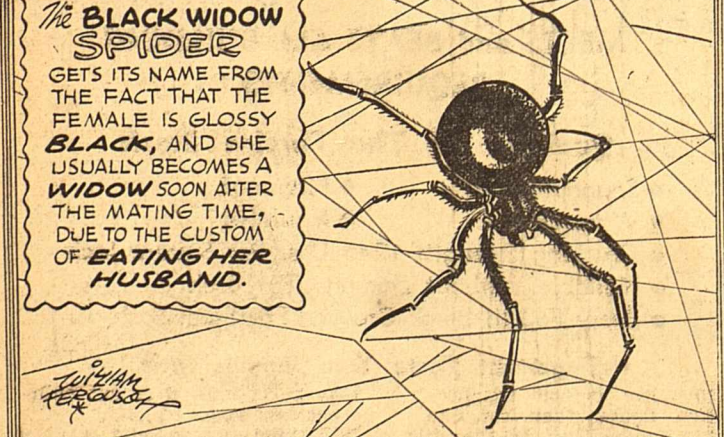

The figure compares to 1,287 oil well completions for the comparable period in 1945. Eleven gas well completions for the week brought the year's total to 231, four wells ahead of the gas

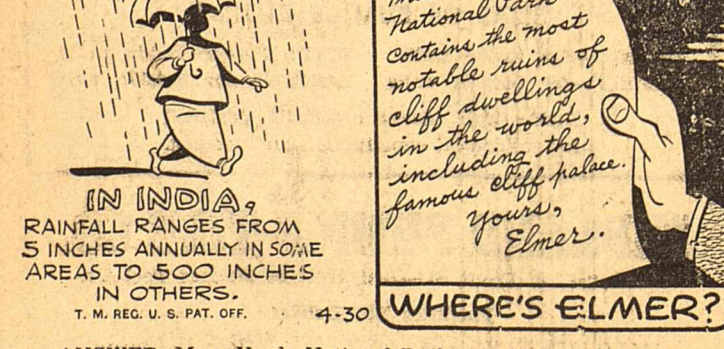

One of the most enjoyable bridge parties of the year is the annual rubber bridge tournament of The Whist Club of New York. This party is conducted for the benefit of the American Contract Bridge League's Children's Fund, which is used to fight cancer in children. As a result of contributions received in connection with it, The Whist Club was able to turn over more than \$4,500 to the fund this year.

Here is one of the interesting hands that came up during the tournament. South was 490 points behind. If he bid a game and made

it, he would get 120 points plus 300 for game, and the honors would make it \$20. Without the 100, honors, he needed a slam. His four-heart bid, therefore, was the correct one. West was trying to protect his hand when he went to six clubs. In the play South actually could make five hearts by taking the spade finesse and playing for a squeeze.

A pretty play came in with West playing the six-club contract. You can see that if he played for the club suit to break, he would go down 500 points. His correct play is to lead a small club immediately, thus preventing North and South from cashing their spade tricks.

Police School 'Students' Solve FBI Murder Mystery

By MAC ROY RASOR AUSTIN—(AP)—A telephone jingled at the Texas Department of Public Safety. "There's a fellow killed out here," an out-of-breath voice puffed over the phone. "Yessir, I just seen him while ago. Over at the Texas Rangers' horse stable. I'm the caretaker. Just ran here. No sir, I ain't gonna guard nothing. I ain't going back there!"

Lee of Freeport were assigned to take pictures. Charles R. "Skeezix" Cavin of Sweetwater took charge of the footprint search and plaster casting. Joe E. Lowry of Corpus Christi and T. R. VA Says Price Ceilings On GI Homes Too High

WASHINGTON—(AP)—The price ceilings for new houses generally are ten per cent or more above the "reasonable value" on which GI loans are based, the Veterans Administration reported, and veterans therefore are having difficulty getting the loans. Francis Pavesick, head of the VA loan guarantee section, told reporters he had instructed the agency's appraisers to ignore "ceilings as they exist today" in determining "reasonable value" for GI loan purposes. Gen. Omar N. Bradley, veterans administrator, has called the situation to the attention of Housing Administrator Wilson Wyatt and expressed hope for early action closing the spread between ceilings and what VA regards as "reasonable value."

Part Of Driscoll Ranch Estate Is Purchased

ROBSTOWN—(AP)—A real estate transaction, believed to be the largest in the history of Robstown involving property within the city limits, has been made by Herman Wood and Dudley Dunlap, who purchased an 88-acre tract from the trustees of the Driscoll estate. The two Robstown business men have formed the Dunlap & Wood Development Company and said they plan to make a new survey and plat of the tract in order to sub-divide the acreage to include business, industrial and residential sites. The land was once a part of the original Robert Driscoll Ranch. have gone up sharply and to follow "proper, sensible practices" in making appraisals for GI loans, but would not guarantee loans on houses selling for more than "reasonable value." Reports from virtually all sections of the country, he said, indicate that ceilings are "too high." Pavesick said one builder, with a ceiling ranging from \$8,500 to \$9,200, told VA that he could make money building the houses for \$6,400.
