Japan's top statesmen agreed to surrender, Kiyose said, in the belief they would not be prosecuted as war criminals.

Kiyose also contended that because Japan did not surrender unconditionally she was not required to observe every order of supreme headquarters "but only those which are in accord with the Potsdam Declaration."

Thus he challenged the tribunal's authority to try the defendants on charges of crimes against peace and crimes against humanity —charges which make up a large part of the indictment against the defeated



Japs Argue Surrender Was Conditional Exile's Documents Incriminate Spain

NEW YORK-(P)-The Spanish government-in-exile said flatly Monday that the Franco regime is threatening world peace by working on atomic energy with the aid

This statement is contained in one of the documents which Dr. Jose Giral, premier of the government-in-exile, brought from Paris Sunday for presentation to the United Nations sub-committee investigating the Spanish ques-

Although the 350-page report still had not been presented to the United Nations Monday afternoon, it was learned from a reliable source that it contained a statement that atomic research :was being carried out in two Spanish cities - Gra-

dada and Murcia. The report, which Giral said would be submitted "within the next 24 hours," also said that: 1. Generalissimo Francisco Franco was maintaining a huge military force, a large part of which was

massed on the French frontier. 2. The Franco regime was not only sheltering many notorious Nazis, but actually was employing many former Gestapo agents in its secret police.

3. Franco was violating human rights by "tortures, terrorism and cruelties" in Spanish jails and concentration camps.






Plane Crash Takes 27 Lives

Negotiations For India's Freedom Termed Failure

SIMLA, INDIA—(P)—The British cabinet mission, admitting failure of an eight-day conference with Moslem and Hindu leaders on independence for India, made it plain Monday that it still had hopes of solving the Indian prob-

The conference ended in complete breakdown Sunday, thus dealing a severe blow to the hopes of those who had expected a quick transition from British control to Indian self-government. Two communiques issued after

the breakdown—one jointly by the cabinet mission, the Moslem League and the Congress Party; the other by the cabinet mission alone—gave no reason for collapse of the negotiations. It seemed apparent, however, that

the conference had floundered on demands of the Moselm League for an independent Moslem state (Pakistan). These demands have been bitterly opposed by the Congress Party, which favors an India unified at least insofar as foreign affairs, defense and communications are concerned.

No Ice Cream And Cake

Secretary of Commerce Henry Wallace has again taken up the controversial subject of party discipline of Democratic congressmen who vote against the administration. This time he did not advocate a purge of the stubborn brethren. But his advice to a party rally in San Francisco did suggest denying them committee ap-

The secretary said that he wasn't trying to stifle the free speech or free vote of any congressman. "He can let his conscience be his guide. But he should not expect any ice cream and cake if he has set fire to the living room," was the way Wallace put it.

There was just enough mixture of general and specific in Wallace's speech to cause wonder whether he was offering a program of broad, long-range reform or prescribing an immediate antidote for the Republican-conservative Democratic coalition that is upsetting the administration's legislative apple cart. But one thing is certain. It was Henry Wallace, practical politician, and

not Henry Wallace, idealist, who was speaking.
Wallace would have a majority member of Congress back the major issues on which he and his party were elected. Then, on new issues, he would have him abide by the majority decision of his party's congressional leaders and a party caucus.

That, of course, is in line with the way our government works. We accept the majority decision in election of a President. We accept the vote of a majority in Congress for the enactment of laws, and of a Supreme Court majority in deciding upon their validity and interpreta-

But all this acceptance carries with it the right to howl, complain, denounce, and rebel. That is not the case with Wallace's plan. The dissident majority member would have to button his lip and vote with the majority. To follow the guidance of a protesting conscience would mean losing his ice cream and cake, and possibly being charged with political arson as well.

Under such a plan, any important piece of legislation introduced by the major party would be sure of passage. The only expression of guaranteed personal opinion, for or against, would come from the minority side of the aisle. The majority would debate and vote en bloc.

If it were possible for a political party to chart a specific four-year program and, if elected, stick to it, Wallace's plan might seem more workable. But everyone, including Wallace, knows that a party platform is mostly a vote-catcher to which neither electors nor elected pay much attention after the campaign closes. Furthermore, the platform can't anticipate changes or emer-

Both parties' platforms of 1944 are full of forgotten promises. Neither contains anything about universal military training, draft extension, full employment, merger of the armed services, OPA extension, or national health legislation.

Wallace implies that administration-backed legislation is always right. He also implies that voters have the chance to "discipline" congressmen only at election time, and that otherwise the congressional party caucus is always right in its majority opinion. Further, he would penalize a majority member for thinking and acting against the prescribed tide.

The secretary's suggestions are worth thinking about. 


