When a player holds nine trumps n the combined hands and the adverse trumps break three-one, he ill usually complain of hard luck. Occasionally, however, the loss of trump trick may be utilized to declarer's advantage.

I saw a fine player go down on oday's hand, not through hard



luck, but through carelessness. He lost a diamond, a heart, and two spades, but the fact that the hearts broke badly could have saved him trick. The opening club lead should be won in dummy with the queen and ace of hearts cashed which leaves West with the good ueen of hearts.

Declarer then should lead a dianond towards his king-queen. West vill win with the ace and exit with either a club or a diamond, South wins with the king, cashes the ace of clubs, goes over to dummy with another club and trumps the ten of diamonds. Then he leads a small heart. West must win and can lead nothing but a spade. Thus declarer loses only one spade trick.
