## Three Die As Flood Sweeps Pennsylvania Carter Glass Of Virginia, Agreement

### Property Damage In Millions

WILLIAMSPORT, PA .-(AP)—Raging flood waters of the Susquehanna River swept over large areas of North-Central Pennsylvania and Southern New York state Tuesday, damaging millions of dollars worth of property and causing

The most severe flood in this area since 1936 covered a fifth of the residential areas of this city of 45,000 persons and left the dis-

In the oil region near Bradford Pa., flood damage was estimated at more than \$500,000.

As the crest of the flood moved east and south Tuesday, water swept over banks at Look Haven Towanda and Wilkes-Barre, Pa. and in other areas.

In Williamsport the flood, caused by four days of heavy rains culminating in a cloudburst Monday reached a stage of 27.5 feet at 7:30 a. m., five and a half feet above flood stage, with a crest of 33 fee



#### Safeguarding Atomic Secrets

While the new atomic energy bill just agreed on by Brien McMahon's special committee is mild compared to the original May-Johnson bill, it is still plenty tough. The original May-Johnson bill proposed fines up to \$300,000 and imprisonment up to 30 years for disclosing atomic secrets. The new bill puts the maximum at \$20,000 and 20 years, but that's still a long, long time and a lot, lot of money.

Prohibitions in the McMahon bill are numerous.

It would be unlawful for any individual to own any facilities for the production of fissionable materials or to own any of the materials unless licensed to do so by the

It would be unlawful for any U.S. citizen to deal in fissionable materials, export them or import them, or engage in their production outside the United States.

It would be unlawful for any individual to use any fissionable material in a weapon.

In short, the five-man Atomic Energy Commission has almost complete monopoly control under the measure, and this extends to control over information on atomic energy. The McMahon bill would direct the commission to pass out information somewhat more readily than has been the practice in the past eight months, but only if this would not jeopardize the common defense and security.

Information on industrial uses would be shared with other nations, but only after Congress has declared it's safe to do so. That probably won't happen for a long,

The commission would be directed to establish libraries and information services to see that scientific 21 Redactor progress was encouraged. But restrictions would seem to nullify this big-hearted sharing of secrets. Anything which the commission classified as "restricted data" would be closely guarded, and the commission could write its 27 London own regulations as to what should be restricted.





#### **Evictions Pending** Appeals On Rules WASHINGTON -(P)- The Su-

Courts Can Prevent

preme Court Monday ruled federal courts can prevent eviction of tenants pending appeals based on OPA

The Justice Department appealed from the Sixth Federal Circuit Court at Cincinnati which said it had no jurisdiction to enjoin eviction proceedings in state courts. In one case the government con-tended Robert C. Beever was evicted improperly from his apartment after the landlord began proceedings before a Covington, Ky., justice of the peace to regain possession. The U. S. Circuit Court said it could do nothing because at the time it considered the case the ten-

ant had left the apartment.

In the other case OPA had sought to restrain eviction of a tenant from a Columbus, Ohio house owned by the estate of Emma Gang. The circuit court denied OPA's request for an injunction pending the tenant's appeal. Justice Black said the circuit

court was wrong in its finding that the Beever case was moot. "The bare fact that the Beevers in order to comply with the writ of possession vacated their apartment was not enough to end the

controversy," Black said. In the Columbus case, Black said the OPA was not barred by a section of the federal judicial code from going into federal court to equest an injunction halting "an unlawful eviction."



The Reporter-Telegram got beat Monday night, in a directors' meeting—a thing the teams from which the voters came have very seldom been able to do on the playing field. The vote was 5 to 1 that the Reporter - Telegram must forfeit a game it won from Mackey Motors because Whitworth played with them. One team manager would not

Shortstop Whitworth desired to leave Midland Hardware and play with the Reporter. His mistake was he didn't get a written release although he gave a two-week oral notice. This technicality was tagged on him. He graciously played with Midland Hardware, with JayCee permission, only the night before he played with the Reporter, in order to help his former teammates field a playing team.

This was the first decision granted so far this season on a protest. There have been multiple protests and some written, which never were acted upon. This was the first. It was the plea of the Reporter that the incident came during a disorganized time of the league and that certainly is true. Pct. Directors Ruthless

The directors were ruthless Monday night. They also ruled Burl's must forfeit to Equitable a game for which the One-Stop had five men out for high school graduation. The directors deaf-eared Burl's plea for justice on that point.

We can name at least a dozen other protests which never were acted upon by any board of directors or any czar or anybody.

It is cheering on one point—the league intends to be strict. But it got strict on events of the past and selected only two isolated cases to make examples

Now there really will be "play for keeps" on the diamond. Teams shunted in the directors' meeting will be out to show and show.

If the team ruled against Monday night had been a Podunk softball nine, this corner would still contend the directors acted hastily on a matter of good faith. Acted wrong. Bo Mitchell, manager of the Reporter team, had secured permission from three JayCees before playing Whitworth. The permission was granted by the three men, who have been active in softball for Midland. What else could Mitchell do? Where could he look for some authority to play his man? The JayCees did not answer his questions and they washed their hands of his entreaty and turned it over to the directors.


