



### Franco's Flourishing Fascism

Generalissimo Francisco Franco gave a repeat performance of the standard Franco speech at the opening of the second parliament session of his seven-year regime. As usual, the generalissimo denounced Russia, communism, Masonry, and outside interference. He denied that he is a dictator. He again reminded the Spanish people how happy they are, and again assured them that they are living under a government which they have freely chosen.

All that is familiar stuff. But Franco also emphasized a couple of points that he hasn't stressed too strongly before. One was that Spain has no political problems to settle. The other, a warning to those who are "pushing" him from outside, was that "when one is pushed he doesn't go faster.- His first impulse is to pause and then even to turn back."

It is probably true that, internally, Spain has few political problems.
