Close Ports To Work Out Strike Plans

WASHINGTON -(AP)-Harbor activities at New York, Baltimore and other ports began bogging down Thurday as AFL seamen started quitting work to attend simultaneous emergency meetings on all U. S. sea coasts.

The surprise AFL walkout was scheduled at 2 p. m. but the men left their ships several hours sooner in some cases.

A union official in New York said he contacted 75 ships in the port and found a "100 per cent stoppage" on those manned by AFL crews. The stoppage was reported underway in Baltimore also. manned ships were not affected. In Washington a congressiona

committee decided to try to avert a CIO maritime strike scheduled June 15. Only Two Victims Railroad Commission Of Chicago Fire Are Unidentified

CHICAGO-(AP)-A series of offi cial investigations was begun Thursday in the disastrous La Salle Hotel fire, while friends and relatives of victims were completing positive identification of 54 of the 58 dead. Still remaining unidentified were the bodies of two women, a man, and a torso of undetermined sex. A fifth body was tentatively identi-

fied, through personal possessions, as Louis Marco, 57, of Chicago. All phases of the terrifying flash blaze which routed guests from the Loop hotel early Wednesday morning were under official scrutiny. Evacuation Ordered

As city, county and state officials proceeded with their separate inquiries into Chicago's worst hotel lisaster in history, the hotel management ordered complete evacuation of the fire swept ruins of the 2-story structure. More than 1,000 transient and permanent guests at the 1,000 room, 37-year-old hostelry vere affected.

Too Many Jobs

With millions facing starvation, it might seem that the dictatorship of UNRRA would be a full-time job. But Director Fiorello LaGuardia seems to find plenty of time for other activities. He is a twice-a-week radio commentator, a thrice-weekly newspaper columnist and, we assume, still a politician—at least, he has been on the public payroll for almost 40 of the last 45 years, and is said to covet a seat in the Senate next year.

Even this busy schedule did not prevent his appearing before the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization and attempting to ridicule and demolish, in his cozily sarcastic manner, the nine-point plan of longrange world food administration which former President Herbert Hoover had proposed the day before.

LaGuardia has every right to disagree with Hoover and to express that disagreement. But the petty fault-finding and hair-splitting that he indulged in leave one wondering whether his deepest concern was with the world's hungry millions or whether his intention was to embarrass and belittle Hoover.

The rain was heavy in the north-west part of the county, and a large amount of damage was caused by wind. Considerable hail fell south of Barstow. The Monahans area received from one quarter to three quarters inches, and the area from the Pyote airfield west of Barstow from three to five inches.

Hail destroyed 100 acres of cotton owned by Ed and Jim Miller, 70 acres planted by Mrs. Ennis L. Winchester, 150 acres on Charles Dodson's farms, and 35 acres on the J. H. Ellison farm. All of the farms are located south of Barstow.

MONAHANS - E. W. Sweatt is planning to demonstrate the use of DDT in controling alfalfa insects on approximately 100 acres of alfalfa this year. He will leave 25 acres for a check plot. The demonstration is based on results of DDT application in Utah, where seed yields have been increased 6 1/2 times with one

Records on the demonstration will be kept and made available to interested persons by County Agent John L. Mogford.

The best methods for making the most money on a farm or ranch are worked out and proved by experiment stations and the United States Department of Agriculture, then passed on through the county agent to the farmer and rancher, Mogford said. If Sweatt shows he can increase his alfalfa seed yield sufficiently then next year others will want to try DDT on their alfalfa, crops, he pointed out.

Controling of lice, flies and mosquitoes on cattle on the Burkholder ranch is another demonstration that will be made available to all persons interested, Mogford said. The demonstration is set up with some cattle dipped and some not dipped. Interested persons will be invited to see the results of the de-monstration this fall. Many other demonstrations in feeding, fitting and showing livestock are being carried on this year.



Single Chief Ruled Out As President Studies Merger

WASHINGTON -(AP)- The proposal for a single chief of staff over the armed forces was reported the first casualty Wednesday, as President Truman personally undertook to reconcile Army-Navy merger differences.

The single chief of staff proposal was strongly plugged by the Army but Congressional circles heard reports the President had decided

The fact that Truman is taking over the job of resolving Army-Navy merger disagreement was disclosed after a 90-minute conference held between President Truman, Secretary of Navy Forrestal and Secretary of War Patterson.

White House Press Secretary Charles G. Ross reported Truman termed it "a very constructive ses-

Forrestall Holds Out

Nevertheless, Forrestall was reported sticking by the Navy's contention that two departments, with separate cabinet members, should be maintained instead of the single department of common defense suggested in a bill sponsored by Chairman Elbert D. Thomas (D-Utah) of the Senate Military Com-

While there was some indication that those who favor what has come to be known as the Army plan for all-out unification migh be willing to compromise on the proposal to retain two cabinet members, few senators thought any basic changes in the military lineup will get serious consideration

in this Congress.

Discussing the recent White House conference, Ross informed newsmen that all points of Army-Navy disagreement were "thoroughly discussed by all sides" before Truman took them under advise

"He will decide what form of unification will be the policy,"

Ross was unable to indicate when Truman's decision would be forth-coming, or what form it might

He said, however, "all of this is moving toward unification."

HELPFUL SUGGESTIONS

for electric refrigerator owners while the food emergency exists



The new low electric rates mean that you can operate your electric refrigerator at still lower cost, right at a time when the cost of living is going up.

Your electric refrigerator, by saving food and reducing waste, is playing an important part in helping conserve scarce food items during the present emergency. In order that your electric refrigerator will continue to serve efficiently and economically during this period of food shortages, take good care of it and observe the following rules:

- 1. Don't place hot foods in your refrigerator. Let them cool
- 2. Place a cover over warm foods.
- 3. Don't open the refrigerator door more often than absolutely necessary.
- 4. Don't leave the door open while carrying food to other
- 5. Defrost frequently, at least once a week. When the frost on the freezer unit becomes more than a quarter of an inch thick, it lowers the efficiency of your refrigerator.
- 6. Speed up defrosting by placing hot water in the ice cube trays. After defrosting is completed, change the hot water to cold water for making ice cubes.
- 7. Keep the refrigerator at the normal temperature recommended by the manufacturer. Too low a temperature isn't necessary and may be wasteful.
