#### College Girl Held In Baby's Death



The French, to whom we are indebted for our political designations of left and right, seem to have scrapped these symbols pretty thoroughly in their recent elections. For the three parties which won the majority of votes are all to the left. Yet the Communists, traditionally the leftest of the leftist parties, lost out apparently because of their rightist tendencies.

For if right means restriction as well as reaction, coercion as well as conservatism, then the French Communist Party is well to the right of the M. R. P., which superseded it, and the Socialists, who ran third. And the bulk of French voters didn't want what the radical right

France is the cradle of European liberty. It was a Frenchman who said, "I wholly disapprove of what you say but will defend to the death your right to say it." And it is obvious that Frenchmen, even though weary, hungry, and dispirited after a disgracing defeat and four years of bondage, did not forget that heritage.

The sentiment of the French today is clearly for socialism. But with their program of advanced socialism, the Communists also offered a program in which democracy and individual liberty played no part. They did not offer this openly. But the stamp of the Moscow pattern was in the Communists' hands, ready to be applied to the country in the event of victory.







Russia's leaders have no illusions about how far her scientists must progress to catch up with the United States and Britain. They are well aware and impressed with the excellence and skill of Ameri-

The leaders and the scientists know they must work and work hard and even then they may lag behind this side of the world. They may have obtained something from Germany, but they are realists enough to know that, if they found something there so did their allies.

The very fact that the Soviets don't say much about the bomb is revealing. It is the belief of many informed foreigners stationed in the Soviet Union today, while the Russians haven't asked for the secret of the bomb, it constitutes a great and ponderous factor in all their thinking and action.

The Pacific is the largest and deepest of the oceans, and with dependent seas has an area of about 55,000,000 miles—equal to the entire land surface of the globe.

#### Swiss Citizenship Costs Thousands

BERN-(A)- Twenty-nine Swiss, mostly residents of Germany, have lost Swiss citizenship because they were accused of conspiracy against Switzerland's security.

In addition, 56 persons lost Swiss citizenship in 1945 because they had made false declarations to obtain Swiss nationality or because their conduct was prejudicial to Switzer-

Loss of Swiss citizenship in many cases is a financial loss, It costs a lot of money to become a Swiss citizen. Government statistics showed that in 1943 in 1,684 cases of naturalization, individuals paid the equivalent of \$361,000 to the communities and \$170,000 to the cantons of their residence.

Individual fees for naturalization vary among the various communities and cantons. The authorities of the communities and of the cantons decide whether citizenship can be granted, but the federal Justice and Police Department is the final

The procedure is long and rig-

"We do not want anyone to become a Swiss citizen who has worshipped foreign ideologies or has taken an active part in foreign politics," a spokesman of the Justice and Police Department said.

A foreigner must have lived for many years in the community to which he would like to belong, before he can fill out an application for naturalization. "In the last ten years," said the

representative of the Justice and Police Department, "the practice has been not to grant citizenship to a foreigner unless he has resided in one and the same canton for at

In 1945, 814 fereigners with their families, a total of 1,526 persons, were granted Swiss citizenship.

#### Men Unaffected By Radar Waves

DENVER-(P)-Relax, war wives. Exposure to radar waves won't leave your GI sterile, balding or anti-social.

Capt. Meyer Berke of Lowry Field Age gave sterility tests to 30 enlisted men who handle aircraft radar. He found them all perfectly normal. Reports rose during the war that radar waves would produce all sorts of ill effects on humans.

One woman complained her husband had nightmares after exposure to the waves.

Another, whose hubby wrote that he had to climb over radar antennae to make repairs, said his photograph showed clearly "he is becoming as bald as an admiral." Scientists took no stock in these

notions but air force surgeons at Duke University made some experiments on guinea pigs, anyway, which seemed to thrive on their diet of electrons.

Berke went a step farther by using men in the tests.
