### West Ector Test Shows Heavy Gas, Flows Distillate

Phillips Petroleum Company No. 1-G TXL in the undeveloped area in West Ector between the TXL and the Wheeler fields, with location in southwest corner of section 11, block 46, TP survey, T-1-S, tested for 5,310,000 cubic feet of gas per day, and four barrels of distillate per hour flowing, on the zone at 8,225-8,390 feet, in the Devonian.

Operator was to set a packer at 8,315 feet and try another drill-stemmer to total depth at 8,390 feet, to check the formation, below the gas cap.  
Extension Flows  
The Texas Company No. 1-C Parker, in northwest corner of section 40, block 45, TP survey, T-1-S, and on southeast side of the TXL-Devonian field, was flowing and testing from pay section at 7,705-7,895 feet through 1,140 perforations in the casing.

In four and three-quarter hours of flowing the well made 132 barrels of oil through open two-inch tubing.  
Skelly Oil Company No. 1-A Texas, Central Southwest Andrews County exploration on south side of the Martin field, and on southeast quarter of section 3, block 11, University survey, was coring below 7,490 feet, in lower Permian lime.

Another Test Due  
Unofficial sources reveal that Placid has a contract to drill a second test on the block of about five and one-half sections, which surrounds the Thornberry location. Such an exploration might find the Ellenburger oil zone thick enough to make a well before the water is encountered—at least that is the opinion of some interested parties.

The Texas Company No. 1-P State, North Southwest Andrews County discovery for production from the Tubb-Permian, at 7,127-7,269 feet, was drilling ahead past 7,945 feet, in lime and chert, after a two-hour drill-stem test at 7,705-7,855 feet, in a zone unofficially reported to likely be the Clear Fork. Recovery was 240 feet of drilling mud and 900 feet of mud, cut with sulphur water. If no better shows are found by subsequent drilling, operator is expected to ultimately plug back and complete from the Tubb horizon.

Argo Oil Corporation No. 1 Roberts, Southeast Reeves County prospect, was making hole below 11,684 feet in sand and shale.  
Humble Oil & Refining Company No. 1 Crespi, East Midland County wildcat, flowed 333 barrels of fluid in 19 hours, of which 90 per cent was salt water and the remainder was sludge with a little oil. The flow was from the Strawn at 10,470-520 feet, after two shots of acid. It showed 660,000 cubic feet of gas per day.

The Plymouth Oil Company No. 1 Slaughter, South-Central Garza County wildcat, about ten miles south of Post, had reached 4,173 feet, in Clear Fork lime. No shows had been reported.  
Tentative top of the Clear Fork has been picked at 3,815 feet, based on drilling time. Samples to that level have not been run yet. Elevation is 2,490 feet.

### India OKs Plan For Federal Union

NEW DELHI—(AP)—The All-India Congress Party accepted Tuesday a long-range British plan for an independent Federated Union of India, but rejected proposals for the establishment of an interim government.

The decision was reached after a final two-hour meeting of the Congress working committee and was announced by Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the party's president, who communicated the information to Viceroy Lord Wavell by telephone.

In view of the Congress Party's acceptance of the long-range plan, informed quarters said, a new official statement on India's constitutional future may be made shortly—perhaps Tuesday night or Wednesday.

There was some speculation that the British proposals for an interim government might be scrapped and that new suggestions would be submitted to leaders of all Indian political groups.

The original proposals called for a 14-man cabinet, on which the Congress Party and the Moslem League each would have five representatives, with the remaining four seats going to minority groups.

The Moslem League announced its acceptance of the British cabinet mission's long-range proposals for Indian independence on June 6. And its spokesmen had indicated approval of the interim government plan although the league had taken no formal action on that question.

While the Congress Party's acceptance of the long-range proposals was generally regarded as a long step forward in settling India's political future, the newspaper "Dawn"—organ of the Moslem League—was critical of the Congress' failure to approve the interim government plan after long delay.

President Truman's disclosure that Moscow has balked at letting American correspondents report on the relief agencies activities in two Soviet republics sent influential House members into an angry huddle.

They tried before but failed to ban the use of United States funds in nations which refused to give American press and radio representatives free access to UNRRA news.

Finally they settled for a provision requiring the President to seek through "appropriate channels" to obtain admission of American correspondents to recipient countries.

"Apparently we did not go far enough and will now have to get tougher," Rep. Clarence Brown (R-Ohio) told a reporter. "It may be that the House now will be willing to insist that no UNRRA funds supplied by the United States be used in countries which won't allow our reporters to go inside and find out how the money is being used."

The final \$465,000,000 American allotment to the UNRRA fund is included in a deficiency appropriation bill scheduled for House consideration late this week. It will bring this country's total contribution to \$2,700,000,000.

Reporting to Congress on Russia's position, Truman said Monday "satisfactory arrangements are in effect to permit American press and radio representatives to report without censorship on the UNRRA programs in all UNRRA receiving countries except the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics."

### SEEKS TO RECONCILE U. S. AND SOVIET Australia Drafts Atom Plan

NEW YORK—(AP)—Australia put forward Tuesday a proposal to set up one master committee to draft plans for atomic energy control and reconcile, if possible, the bitterly contested points of divergence in the separate programs by the United States and Russia.

The Australian plan appeared to lean toward the United States' program calling for a supreme control factor which would emerge eventually as the international atomic development authority proposed by Bernard M. Baruch.

It opposed the Russian proposal to set up two separate committees, the first for exchange of scientific information on atomic developments among the United Nations and the second to be concerned solely with atomic control.

The Australian plan was disclosed by Dr. Herbert V. Evatt, Australian foreign minister and chairman of the United Nations Atomic Energy Commission.

Its disclosure came close on the heels of a Moscow press attack on the American atomic policy in which the official Communist newspaper Pravda accused the United States of attempting to wield "atomic diplomacy as a measure of 'evident striving for world rule.'"

Calling the Russian charge that the U. S. plans to rule the world "ridiculous," Senator Russell (D-Ga.), a committee member, told a reporter he thinks "the Russians should stop judging all other nations' motives by their own selfish attitudes."

"Nobody in the world has ever offered to give away so much for so little," the Georgia senator declared. "The Baruch plan is a generous proposal in which we offer to give away a development bought with our genius and our money. All we ask in return is protection for the world and ourselves against its use for destructive purposes."

### 22 Defendants Plead Guilty To Car Conspiracy

DETROIT—(AP)—Twenty-two of 31 defendants pleaded guilty Tuesday to taking part in what the federal government described as a three-million dollar conspiracy to buy and sell used automobiles above ceiling prices.

Seven other defendants entered not guilty pleas and Federal Judge Arthur J. Keenan began their trial immediately. Action on the case of the remaining two defendants was held in abeyance by the government.

The OPA, following a lengthy investigation, charged that the defendants had taken part in a conspiracy to buy used cars at over ceiling prices in Detroit lots. The automobiles were then channeled through Murray, Ky., and Cairo, Ill., and resold at over ceiling prices in Southern and Southwest states, according to the OPA.

A federal grand jury indicated the 31 men, a majority of whom are from Kentucky, several weeks ago.

Judge Kosinski set no date for sentencing of the 22 defendants who pleaded guilty. Instead, he ordered bonds of \$1,000 each continued pending a probation investigation.

### Solons Threaten To Withhold UNRRA Aid To Soviet Russia

WASHINGTON—(AP)—A "none-for-Russia" tag on this country's \$465,000,000 final contribution to UNRRA became a definite possibility Tuesday.

President Truman's disclosure that Moscow has balked at letting American correspondents report on the relief agencies activities in two Soviet republics sent influential House members into an angry huddle.

They tried before but failed to ban the use of United States funds in nations which refused to give American press and radio representatives free access to UNRRA news.

Finally they settled for a provision requiring the President to seek through "appropriate channels" to obtain admission of American correspondents to recipient countries.

"Apparently we did not go far enough and will now have to get tougher," Rep. Clarence Brown (R-Ohio) told a reporter. "It may be that the House now will be willing to insist that no UNRRA funds supplied by the United States be used in countries which won't allow our reporters to go inside and find out how the money is being used."

The final \$465,000,000 American allotment to the UNRRA fund is included in a deficiency appropriation bill scheduled for House consideration late this week. It will bring this country's total contribution to \$2,700,000,000.

## Pacific Islands' Government

Efforts to arrive at a decision on how the several hundred populated and liberated islands of the Pacific are to be governed are getting nowhere fast.

The islands are now administered by the Office of Island Government in the Navy Department, Capt. W. F. Jennings commanding. Under Captain Jennings are some 300 naval government officers and 500 enlisted men. The Navy hopes to reduce this number by more than half.

The U. S. Commercial Company—an RFC subsidiary—is trying to nurse the islands back to economic health, but it's a slow process.

Since shortly after the end of the war, the Navy has been making statements as to which of the liberated islands it wants for permanent bases. Kwajalein, Eniwetok, Majuro, Saipan, Tinian, Manus, and Palau are on the list, plus, of course, the old bases at Samoa, Midway, and Guam. The Navy's wartime investments in these bases run close to a billion dollars. They range from \$5,000,000 on Majuro to \$275,000,000 on Guam.

The Navy is now in the process of turning over to the Army control of the Ryukyus, Okinawa and the Bonins are already under General MacArthur. But, aside from these, the War Department refuses to give any indication as to what bases it considers necessary for ground and air security in the Western Pacific.

## Death To The Veto

The veto power which the Big Five wield in the United Nations must go, says Senator Joseph H. Ball, "if we are to control effectively the threat of a third world war fought with atomic weapons."

The senator is obviously right. Let us hope that sufficient pressure may be exerted to kill the unilateral veto right before the UN is faced with a new foredoomed failure in its most important task—the preservation of peace in the face of a threat of a major and imminent war.
