

Brewster is a member of both the Senate-House committee which delved into the blame behind Pearl Harbor and of the Senate's special War Investigating Committee, now engrosseed in an attempt to summon May for testimony concerning his relations with a Midwestern munitions combine.

Central figure in the projected new inquiry is Col. Theodore Wyman. Jr., Army district engineer in the Hawaiian department when the Japanese struck Pearl Harbor. Five months later Wyman was assigned to the Canol oil project in Canada. That was an undertaking which the Senate committee, then headed by President Truman as a senator, de-clared in a Dec. 23, 1943, report never should have been started. Asks Separate Inquiries

Referring specifically to "the Wy-man matter," the Pearl, Harbor committee in its final report Saturday called for appropriate Senate or House committees to make a separate inquiry into delays in constructing Hawaiian defenses before the Japanese attack.



Individualism To The Rescue

Despite all the speeches about democracy and dictatorship, and all the talk about national strength, geographical position and spheres of influence, international relations are determined in the end by the nature and character of the men who conduct them. This has been true throughout recorded history and remains true today. It is alternately a frightening and a comforting fact. And nowhere has it been better illustrated recently than at the Paris conference.

The foreign ministers' deadlock had held fast since last September, and showed no signs of breaking. Reasons of ideology and policy were cited to support the conhappened. No one expected the miracle, or could predict its nature. But apparently it has come to pass in the shrewd persussive possessive poss tention that an agreement was impossible unless a miracle shrewd, persuasive personality of Georges Bidault, premier and president of France.



Representing a country important enough to receive consideration but not strong enough to force an issue, he seems to have played both ends against the middle. Or to put it more politely, he apparently could see and appreciate the intransigent positions of Russia on the one side and America and Britain on the other, and by this longer perspective suggest solutions acceptable to all.
