# Six Huri As Losers Steal **Ballot Boxes** U. S. To Investigate

Six-Hour Jail Fight ATHENS, TENN. —(A)— A bi-partisan group of form-

er GIs, their election to Mc-Minn County offices conceded by a leader of the opposition, brought quiet to bullet ridden Athens Friday after a bloody six-hour gun battle around a now battered jail.

At least 18 persons were injured, six seriously, in the election day strife which began Thursday afternoon and continued until 3 a. m. when a score or more deputized officers surrendered their hold on the two-story brick prison building.

Before complete order could be restored, several automobiles were overturned or stripped, and near riots swept over this town of 7,000, sucuenty perett of formal law enforcement from county agencies.

A mobilization of State Guardsmen was cancelled and a spokesman for the former GI forces said they would maintain order until a mass meeting Monday when it was hoped some provision for county offices would be made.

In Washington, Attorney General Tom Clark ordered an investigation Friday of the gun battle. The Civil Rights Section of the Justice Department was directed to determine whether federal laws were violated.
The battle of the jail, pocked and battered from bullets and home made bombs tossed by GI sympa-

thizers, was a direct outgrowth of the bitter political campaign waged by the veterans to overturn the Democratic organization of State Senator Paul Cantrell, in power for

a decade. Frank Cantrell, mayor of nearby Etowah, telephoned an Athens newspaper Friday that "on behalf to concede the election to the for-mer GI candidates to prevent further shooting." Both towns are in Chattanooga and Knoxville.

NAZI COMMANDER IN NORWAY TO BE SHOT





### Two Trials

A few hours after Gen. Draja Mikhailovitch died before a firing squad in Belgrade, Lt. Nicolai Redin of the Soviet Navy found himself freed of a charge of espionage by a jury in Seattle. Perhaps it is stretching a point to connect the two events. Yet the contrast between the trials of the two men offers an interesting comparison.

The Mikhailovitch trial was as notable for its omissions as for its disclosures. The disclosures were confus-There were admissions of Chetnik-Partisan clashes, but doubt as to who fired the first shot. There were admissions of meetings with Nazis, but doubt as to whether these were for the purpose of arranging collaboration or

Omitted, however, was any mention of the first two years of General Mikhailovitch's international fame. During that time, between the Nazi invasion and Communist Marshal Tito's belated emergence, the Chetnik leader and his guerrillas harassed the Nazis, upset their timetable for the Russian invasion, and kept Nazi divisions engaged which Hitler might have used in his losing race for Moscow against the approach of Russia's freezing winter.

Nothing was heard from Allied fliers and others who Nothing was heard from Allied filers and others who had been rescued by the Chetniks and had seen them in action against the Nazis. These men, anxious to testify, action against the Nazis. These men, anxious to testify, were refused the opportunity. Allied personnel and policy received some disparaging comment at the trial. But

Americans and Britons were not permitted to speak in defense of the general or their own actions.

In short, the accused received a political trial of which the outcome was never in doubt. 

Recently Mrs. Coorse H. Berg-man and Mrs. J. Daub won top score for the evening, and today's hand is the one that did it for

Looking over the scores, it was surprising to note that most of the North-South pairs attempted to play this hand at three no trump, but Mrs. Daub and Mrs. Bergman never came close to that contract. At



some tables West overcalled the diamond bid with a heart, North did two diamonds, and South then bid two no trump to show the heart suit stopped. North, also having a heart stopper, took it to three no trump.

You can see what happened 'against three no trump. The queen of hearts was opened, won by South with the ace, and the diamond suit started. East won with the king of diamonds and returned a heart. Even though declarer held off one round, he had to win the third round. West then got in with the ace of diamonds and cashed the good hearts, thus taking three hearts and two diamonds. Against the diamond contract all the declarer had to lose was the ace and king of diamonds.

This type of hand is difficult to bid. It often is easier to make three no trump than five in a minor, but when a hand has two five-card suits, the distribution usually favors playing it at a suit rather than
