Palestine Issue May Go To UN

Hits Caribbean Area

MIAMI, FLA. —(P)— A radio message from Cuidad Trujillo reported that a fresh tremor shook the Dominican Republic at 7:20 a. m. (CST) Monday in the wake of Sunday's violent earthquake in the Caribbean area.

Pan American Airways in Miami said a message from its Cuidad Trujillo airport described the tremor as being "of slight inten-

No further details were given. Available reports indicated that Sunday's series of quakes apparently centered in the deepest hole in the Atlantic Ocean and was so intense that it knocked out a recording seismograph in St. Louis, more than 2,000 miles away, but caused little surface damage

One report said five tremors hit Ciudad Trujillo, capital of the Dominican Republic, Sunday, with one of the temblors lasting 45

Reports of a tidal wave lacked any confirmation here.

The committee announced Sunday that the resignation of Mansfield last seen here early Friday after the end of the six-hour gun battle for the county jail, had been telegraphed to Gov. Jim McCord, who passed it on to the court.



An Unjust Bargain

Any solution of the Palestine problem almost certainly will be a compromise which the Jews or the Arabs, and perhaps both, will find unsatisfactory. It is not unlikely that there may have to be some added outside considerations to force acceptance by both parties. Yet there is one element of bargain in the federalist constitution reportedly proposed by the Anglo-American committee studying this problem which seems most unjust.

The constitution, it is reported, gives the Jews a strip of territory running along the northern coast of Palestine, across the country, and up the narrow northeastern corridor beween Syria and Lebanon. This embraces 1500 of Palesine's more than 10,000 square miles. The British central government would control Jerusalem, Bethlehem, the port of Haifa, and the southern region of Negev.
