

LUBBOCK - (AP) - Hubert Bechtol, all-American end at the University of Texas the past two years, Saturday informed Coach Dell Morgan of Texas Tech that he will re-enroll at Tech this fall and will play football for the Red Raiders. Bechtol was All-Border Conference end for Tech in 1943 and was named All-American in 1944 and 1945 while playing for the University of Texas as a Naval training

Bechtol's home is at Lubbock. Under rules of the Border Conference, of which Tech is a member, and the Southwest Conference, of which the University of Texas is a member, no war service counts against the eligibility of a player. Thus Bechtol has three years remaining to play. He expects, however, to graduate in 1948.



HOUSTON-(A)-Soft-spoken, 85year-old Mrs. Frances Gordon Jester, who missed being first lady of Texas in 1898, will become first

mother of the state 48 years later. Her son, Beauford Jester, Sunday was assured the office which her late husband, George T. Jester, failed by a small margin to attain-the governorship of Texas.

She might have presided over a governor's table nearly half a century ago, old-timers say, if her husband had accepted the then newly started custom of letting friends put up money to finance a statewide campaign.

Governor-Nominate Jester said his father served as lieutenant governor under the late Charles A. Culberson from 1894 through 1898. With Culberson not seeking re-election in 1898, the elder Jester announced for governor. The late Col. Edward M. House of Houston, who later was to become adviser to Woodrow Wilson, had as Culberson's campaign four years earlier started the practice of accepting money from friends of the candidate to finance his campaign. Colonel House offered to manage Jester's campaign, but, according to ter's campaign, but, according to Beauford Jester, the candidate thanked the colonel and refused.



Am-Vets And CIO Launch Fight To Lift Vet Ceilings

WASHINGTON-(AP)-Labor and veterans' organizations set out Saturday to lift the new \$175-\$200 a month ceilings on pay for war veterans in training with government

Both the American Veterans of World War II and CIO said the new salary top is "less than a living wage.

Jack Hardy, national commander of the American Veterans of World War II, called on all local posts of his organization to back him in asking the next Congress to raise

Officials of the CIO said they are behind the American veterans "and other veterans' organizations" in seeking a higher wage level. They said the present bill "contains three

This is the bill recently passed by Congress which limits government subsistence allowances of veterans who are in college or are taking on-the-job training. Government payments now total about \$100,000,000 a month under the program.

Veterans may receive up to \$65 a month, if single, or \$90 if married, in government subsistence payments. But the amendment specifies if they make more than \$110 a month in salary their subsistence will be reduced correspondingly. Thus they get no government pay if their outside earnings exceed \$175 if single or \$200 if married.

In a statement Saturday Commander Hardy said that under the new ceiling rule a veteran can actually raise his "take home pay" by persuading his private employer to cut his salary.

Clinton Golden, chairman of the CIO veterans' committee, said the "three jokers" in the bill are the ceiling which doesn't permit a veteran to "pursue his studies without place a penalty on the employer who "has a phony on-the-job training program"

Greaf Powers Are Locked In Test Of Strength At Paris

All the noisy acrimony of the Paris Peace Conference has been concerned with trifles compared with the clash of wills between the Western powers and Russia. The great powers are locked in a test of strength and nerves over one

of the oldest issues of world politics,

the Dardanelles. The issue is this: Russia has served demands on Turkey, the quardian of the straits—besides the Dardanelles these include the Bosporus and the Sea of Marmorawhich neither Turkey nor the Western powers find acceptable. There are, first, that the Black Sea powers alone take over control of the straits and, second, that Russia and Turk y jointly assume their defense.



Lake Texoma And Gulf May Be Good Fishing But Coleman Better

By JACK RUTLEDGE

A person planning a vacation and vanting to do a lot of fishing logically would glance at a map of Texas and decide the best place to go would be along the Gulf, where there's lots of water, or to Lake Texoma, or Possum Kingdom, or somewhere like that.

These are good places to go. But you'll probably be surprised to learn that about the best bass fishing in Texas is in Coleman County, which on the map, looks so far from water

you wonder how people exist.

Paradoxically, this water shortage is what makes fishing good there today. They don't even have wells in Coleman County. If the natives dig deep enough, they don't hit water, but oil. You can see how

annoying this must be. They raise a lot of livestock in Coleman County, and stock has to have water. So they began, with government aid, to build tanks and ponds. There are more than 2,000 ponds, some as large as 50,000,000gallon jobs, in Coleman County now And they're building more.

The water that fills them is surface water from rains. To keep the water good, they've stocked it with fish, mainly black bass and blue gill and bream.

Hitler Disregarded Human Lives, Wept When Dog Got Sick

MUNICH — (P) — Adolph Hitler
stood in the big, cold-looking reception room of his chalet at Obersalzburg. There were tears in his eyes and an entreaty in his voice. "If you can save my dog," he said, "you can have anything you want."

Alphons Dopfer, toprank Munich veterinarian and known throughout Germany for his skill with dogs, said he would try. The ailing dog got well. But the fuehrer never paid the bill.

Now 53, Dopfer, a tall, string man, with piercing eyes and clipped mustache, would just as soon forget the 6,000 marks he says Hitler owed him. In the first place, he says, it was forced labor, and his experience at the dictator's chalet and later at army headquarters on the Russian front dismayed his dog

The doctor was working with an office full of squirming dogs, he said, one day in March 1943 when he got a telephone call from one of the fuehrer's staff. In a short while SS men came for him and whisked him off to Obersalzburg.





Only Two Vacancies Remain On Midland School Faculties

School officials reported Saturday that 90 of the 92 positions on the Midland Public School faculties have been filled.

This is a vacancy percentage on only 2.2. A recent survey made by the Texas State Teachers Association showed that 12.7 per cent of 33,958 reaching positions included in the survey were vacant. In rural areas the percentage was 17 per cent. The survey included 75 per cent of all school systems in Texas.

The association indicated that many schools in Texas will be forced to open with a shortage of teachers. Midland school officials Saturday expressed hope for a complete staff when school opens September 9.



It's The Little Things

Some psychiatrists say that we Americans are suffering from a mass neurosis. Radio announcers advise assorted nostrums for that tired, nervous feeling. Various politicians assure us that various things like more government planning, more free enterprise, white supremacy, socialized medicine or the Townsend Plan will put us on our feet again.

Obviously, where there is so much diagnostic smoke there must be some pathological fire. We seem on the way to becoming a sick, nervous nation, if we aren't there already. Some of our symptoms, of course, are evident and have been thoroughly explored, though not cured.

We are well aware of such things as severe shortage

in the midst of bumper production. We understand the jumpy feeling that comes from having a peace conference beat the same old diplomatic bushes while the problem of controlling atomic energy sits unnoticed in the anteroom. We are alert to group and class tension and unrest.

All these add up to a state of confusion and contradictions. But there are other little, inexplicable contradictions and confusions that clutter up our daily lives without our being fully conscious of them. We are unwise to ignore them—for everybody knows that it's the

little things that drive you wacky.
What little things? Well, here are some examples

gleaned from one day's news:

The United States Navy sold two destroyer escorts to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for \$1, or considerably less than the price of two dozen eggs.

Almost half the families in the United States have an aggregate annual income of less than \$2000.

A scarcity of wild animals in Asia and Africa has sent prices so high that American zoo officials have gone on a buyers' strike.

New automobiles are scarce as pearls in oysters. New tires aren't much more plentiful. Old automobiles and tires are wearing out. Getting train or plane reservations is a major achievement. The Commerce Department thinks that vacationing Americans may spend a record \$10,000,000,000 this year.

Flushing, N. Y., site of the New York World's Fair, 38 Dawn goddess is planning a \$50,000,000 shopping center with streets; 39 Encampment cooled in summer and warmed in winter, and with mov- 43 Portuguese ing platforms instead of sidewalks, to save customers the burden of walking. instead of sewage systems. Little things like these, perhaps, are what have a lot of us turning around suddenly and finding nobody there. We ought to face them frankly and fearlessly. The only possible drawback is that, having done so, we might find ourselves a trifle wackier than we were before.

Nothing Is "Good Enough"

So far as the consumer is concerned, the main job upper Peru. of the oil industry is to provide him with a constant, reasonably priced supply of gasoline, fuel oil and other petroleum products when and where he wants them and in the quantities and grades desired.

Looking at the oil industry from the point of view of the long pull, however, some activities which few consumers ever see at first hand are of even greater im-

First, it isn't enough just to have sufficient oil in sight for this year or next year. The industry must think 5, 10, even 20 years ahead. It spends enormous sums in prospecting new potential oil-bearing areas. It sinks deeper wells, in order to get the most out of every field. It carries on elaborate conservation activities to safe-guard oil reserves. As a result of this, vast new reserves constantly are being discovered.

Second, it carries on unceasing laboratory work to develop better oils and lubricants. The many special fuels used for military purposes during the war, such as gasoline of extremely high octane content, are an example. The great progress made is now being adapted to civilian needs. So, little by little, you get better gasoline for your car.

Great producing industries must also be great research industries. Nothing must ever be considered good enough-instead, a constant search must be made for something better. Oil typifies that industrial philosophy.


The city of Nuernberg, Germany, has presented the Allies with a bill for \$4.09, same being the funeral expenses of Robert Ley, the Nazi labor leader who hanged himself while awaiting trial.

For a prize example of two-bit German arrogance, that would be hard to beat. Equally arrogant is their reason for the bill-that Ley was the responsibility of the Allied military court.

Apparently the city fathers of Nuernberg have forgotten whose resposibility the Nazi leaders were, and who was responsible for the insane continuation of a lost war that reduced their city and much of their country

Now, undoubtedly, the Nazis and the ruin and the hunger are, to their forgetful minds, the responsibility of the conquerors. The Nuernbergers, whose city was the shrine of Nazidom and whose thousands heiled its leaders to the echo, feel put upon. And so, in hurt indignation, they refuse to pay the reparation-\$4.09 to put away the bull-necked straw boss whose guilt-crazed mind drove him to suicide.

A resumption of full scale warare appears imminent in Manhuria, that unhappy cockpit of the Orient. The Chinese Communists hold most of the country and appear determined to stay. tionalists, thus far held to the railways and cities of the southern tip, show equal determination to regain this rich territory, withheld from them by a succession of invaders for the last 15 years. Man-churia is the prize most worth fighting for in Eastern Asia, despite the dismantling by the Russians of the best part of the great military industrial plant built up there by the Japanese.

Few parts of the world have seen more of war and its resultant mis-ery for the civilian population than Manchuria since the beginning of the century.

Unless some near miracle halts China's civil strife it is logical that Manchuria should be the main battlefield. The fortunes of war in the last days of Japan's imperialist adventure opened it to the Communist armies, who came in from the west while the Russians from the north were scoring their oneweek victory over the crumbling pride of Japan's war machine, the

nation to remain, the Communists have announced from their present capital in Yenan the establishment of their own government of Man-Every consideration dictates that

Relations between the Chinese Communists and Moscow remain pretty much a mystery to the outside world. But if the Communists hold on in Manchuria it is inevitable that a fast community of interest should be established. Although Moscow in the year-old Russian-Chinese treaty promised to give aid to China only through the National government-apparently disavowing the Communistsother parts of that agreement make it impossible for them not to have close dealings with the Communists -provided the latter can stick in



West thought for a while and finally went in with the king. It is difficult to understand why a player will win a trick when he does not know what to play next. Then East made the mistake of not overtaking with the ace of clubs. Had East overtaken with the ace



and laid down the ace and a small diamond, he would have defeated the contract; but now all West could do was to lay down the king of spades, which declarer trumped, and then proceeded to cross-ruff the

By JAMES DEVLIN HEREFORD, GERMANY -(A)-Without peanuts and popcorn, an estimated two dozen circuses are bringing some cheer to the civilian population and occupation troops in Germany's drab, ruined cities.

The estimate is that of Mario

Althoff Circus playing here. Mayerhoff is an anti-Nazi born in Berlin of Argentine parents. The young veteran of Oswecim

and Dauchau said his father was Enrico Mayerhoff, of Buenos Aires, and that he has an American aunt. Mrs. Betty Atlas, of Chicago.

Mayerhoff spoke ruefully of hardships under which the circuses op-erate. He said a number of the great shows suffered serious bomb damage, and that few had any wild animals left.

Food is scarce for both artists and animals. Transportation is a constant problem. Much of the equipment is old and battered. Yet, the show goes on.

German Flags Fly The Althoff Circus is typical of the postwar shows. Its one tent, with German flags of blue, white, red, white and blue horizontal stripes flying from its peaks, is surrounded by horse-drawn trailers in which the performers live.

It is more intimate than larger shows. German men, women and children and British troops sit on benches placed so close to the ring that sometimes tanbark is kicked into their laps.

Americans notice two main differences from their type of shows. The music is provided by an or-chestra instead of a band. The clowns are vocal, often halting to tell jokes instead of relying solely on pantomime.

Horse acts predominated, including one in which two horses gave themselves a well-balanced ride on a see-saw. Cilly Feindt, blonde star of the show, rode a horse which danced a fox trot to "Lili Marlene" and a waltz to "Blue Danube."

Another blonde, Rita Kambach,

spun around on a star atop a tenoot pole balanced on the shoulders of a partner.
