1,994 gave their preference in the presidential lsweepstakes.
Of those, $40 \%$ voted for Carter, $35 \%$ voted for uncommitted 1,994 gave their preference in the presidential sweepstakes.
Of those, $40 \%$ voted for Carter, $35 \%$ voted for uncommitted
delegates, $23 \%$ voted for Sen. Kennedy and $2 \%$ voted for
California Gov. Jerry Brown. The final unofficial tally here was Carter 793 , Kennedy 454 .
Brown 44 and Uncommitted 703 .
President Carter proved more popular statewide as he garnered $56 \%$ of the Texas Democratic vote, while Kennedy
polled $22 \%$, and $11 \%$ preferred uncommitted delegates.
