Dock Workers Join Laborers In Protest Against Use Of Legislature—first since the close of the war—convened Troops To Move Supplies

LONDON-(AP)-A mass meeting of London dock workers voted Tuesday to join some 30,000 union laborers branches of the Legislature got off in a walkout protesting the use of troops to move food supplies held up by a nine-day strike of London truck

> The decision, which may affect all of London's 24,-000 organized dock workers, was reached at a 40-minute noon hour meeting attended by between 1,200 and 1,400

With food distribution throughout England threatened by the spreading walkouts, government, officials, employers' representatives and union leaders hurriedly set up fast-moving machinery to negotiate a settle-

More than 2,000 soldiers—angrily termed "blacklegs (strike-breakers) in uniform" by the strikers-and 800 service vehicles meanwhile began their second day of lugging meat 10,000,000 inhabitants of the Greater London area.

With the soldiers taking over delivery duties, food in limited quantities began re-appearing in London shops that had been almost drained of supplies during the work

This is a prophecy and a warning. There's more disagreement in store for the United Nations. How serious the forthcoming rift will be we can's say, but it's bound to

give rise to bitter words and hot disputes.

The disagreement probably will start when the time comes to select an architect to design the UN's permanent home on Manhattan Island. And it surely will attain sizable proportions when the architect's first sketches are submitted. For the physical situation of the headquarters site offers problems that are going to give the tradition of public-building architecture a severe jolt, and possibly a permanent one.

Much of modern Europe's government architecture is inherited. Some countries, like England, have preserved their royalty along with the halls and castles which for centuries have housed their succession of monarchs. M. C. Ulmer Will Others, like France and Russia, have taken over the pal aces of their deposed kings and emperors. If additions were needed, the models were already at hand.

Here in the United States there was no problem when it was decided to build a capital city from scratch. There was plenty of room to work in, and the whole rich architectural legacy of the past was at hand for inspiration.

But things are going to be different in New York.
