its invitation, Talmadge said: "If the lieutenant governor will

resign, your governor will resign. The speaker of the House of Representatives will assume executive authority." Under the state constitution, then

the House speaker must call an election within 60 days. The legislative session is expected to end in March.

Talmadge recommended that the legislature remain in session to institute a Democratic white primary and strengthen the election laws regarding qualification of voters.

# **Edouard Herriot Elected To Head** French Assembly

PARIS -(P)- Radical-Socialist leader Edouard Herriot, 74, was elected president of France's national assembly Tuesday.

Herriott, who was unopposed, headed the old chamber of deputies from 1936-1942. He is in his third year as mayor of Lyon, France's third largest city. He succeeds Vincent Auriol, recently elected president of the republic.

Before the voting began, the legislature heard a message read from Auriol calling upon France to "maintain and develop her alliances" and to insist upon "just reparations and a full security'



loosely defined as liberal or progressive. The Communists began in New York State—where they are most numerous—by causing a cleavage in the American Labor Party. The anti-Communists formed the Liberal Party and the Red element stayed with the ALP which, up to now, has retained a majority of the original party's votes.

Then, in last year's political campaigns, a rift de-veloped within the CIO-PAC and the National Citizens-PAC over Communist influence and sympathizers. It spread to the CIO itself and threatened a split at the At-lantic City convention. This was averted by a resolution, drafted by a committee made up equally of right- and left-wingers, which denounced Communist interference without threatening any action if it continued. Now the issue has caused a break between two groups of a more general makeup, the Progressive Citizens of America and the Americans for Democratic Action. The membership of both is studded with famous names of New Deal days. Henry Wallace is principal spokesman for the PCA, while the ADA boasts such supporters as Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt and her son, Franklin, Leon Henderson, Chester Bowles and Wilson Wyatt.

We have called communism a wedge, but much of the force that has driven it came from without. The wartime alliance with Russia and the postwar problem of friendly relations with that country have put the American Communists' customary activities in a different light.

This intensified the confusion which probably was inevitable with the death of President Roosevelt, who had held a group of supporters together throughout our participation in the war. But perhaps the Communist wedge is also helping to bring clarity out of the confusion by pointing up the issue.

The issue is this: Must we put up with subversive activities masquerading as liberalism at home in order to achieve harmony abroad? 



Wallace has not gone this far, especially as regards foreign policy. And it is his undoubted misfortune that his Madison Square Garden speech won him the support of American Communist publications which are now attacking the ADA.

So it seems possible that the Communist wedge may be weakening itself even as it splits the liberal forces wider. For with each new split more persons emphatically dissociate themselves from the Communists. With each new split the Communists' activities are spotlighted more clearly.

As a result, the party in this country may find itself too isolated to prevent the sensible and possible co-operation of a strong, democratic, capitalistic United States with a strong, communistic, totalitarian Russia — a Russia which, of course, would never permit a propagandist for capitalism to open his mouth more than once within the Soviet Union's borders.
