### Pay Your Poll Tax

Midland's Junior Chamber of Commerce again is taking the lead in promoting a poll tax payment campaign—a drive in which every citizen should lend full

With only six days remaining in which to pay poll taxes in order to be eligible to vote, a surprisingly small percentage of potential Midland County voters have paid the tax. Only a short time remains for citizens to protect their rights to vote.

It is strange that the JayCees and others have to promote the payment of poll taxes so citizens may have the privilege of expressing themselves at the polls, but it is the same story each year. The proverbial "Let George do it" spirit prevails when it comes to payment of poll taxes as well as to voting.

Voting is a responsibility rather than a privilege, and in order to vote, a citizen must pay his poll tax not later than January 31, or obtain an exemption if he is entitled to it. It matters not whether a person favors a poll tax. Texas law now provides there is only one way to qualify as a voter.
