# Brownfield Boxer Wins Light Heavy Weight Title

FORT WORTH —(P)— Headed by one defending champion, six newly crowned Golden Gloves tilts and one substitute will represent Texas in the tournament of champions in Chicago next week. Champions crowned were: Flyweight—James Baggett, Dallas. Bantamweight—Valentino Luna, Austin. Featherweight—Bill Henderson, Levelland. Lightweight—Pvt. Dan Stipanovich, Fort Sam Houston, San Antonio. Welterweight—Charles Robinson, Fort Worth. Middleweight—Tommy Barron, Sherman. Lighthtweight—Tom Adams, Brownfield. Heavyweight—Charles Simmons, Dallas.

The only knockouts on the program came in the golden-trophy division—bouts matching outstanding fighters who had been eliminated from championship competition. Monahans Boxer Kayeod Roy Priolo, 183, of Waco, kayeod Albert Hansen, 182, of Monahans, in 1:59 of the first round of the heavyweight bout. Dallas captured the team trophy for the second straight year. Other golden trophy results: Jose Quesada, 112, of El Paso, carried the fight to win a decision over Jack Turner, 108, of Abilene in the flyweight division.

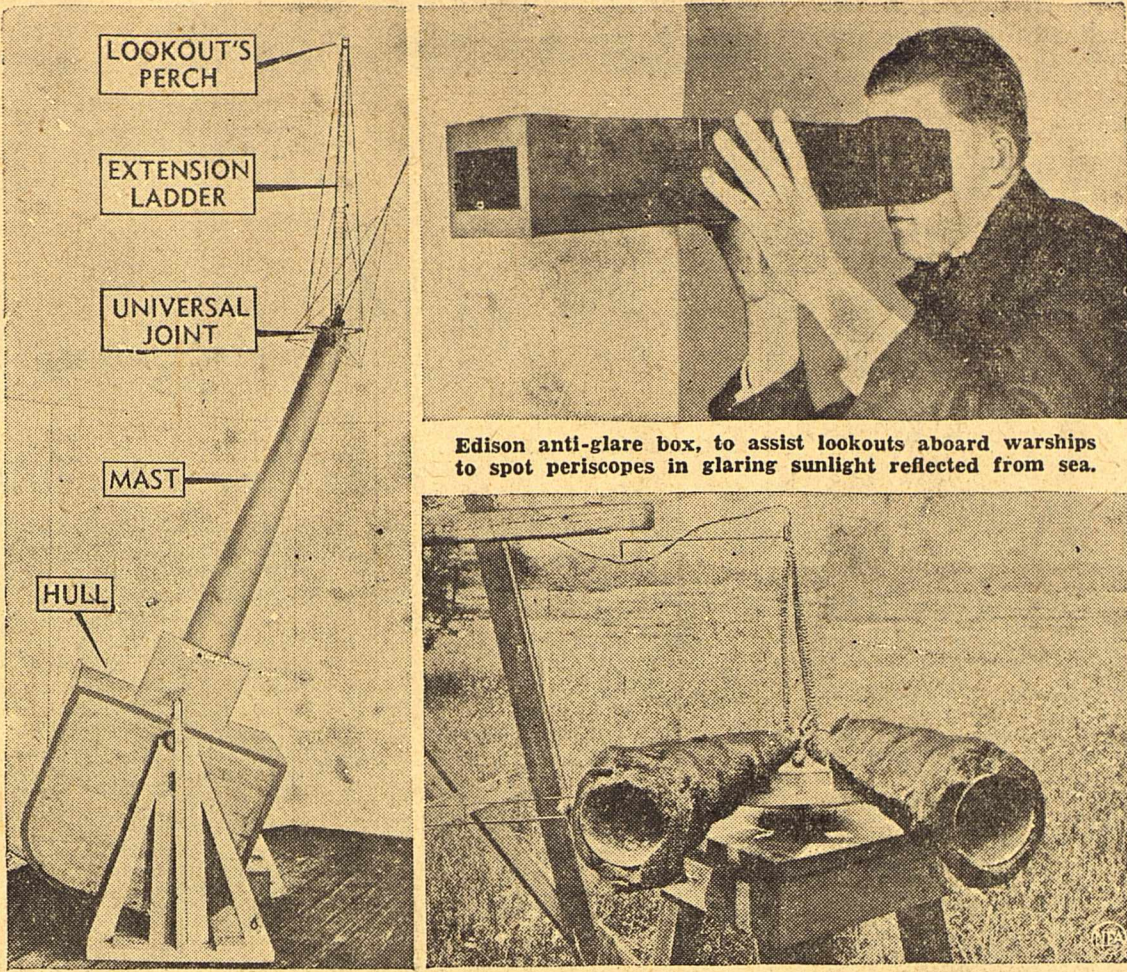
