Although the land was privately owned, the dominion governmen designated it as a sanctuary and the Province of Alberta appointed Pickering as game warden at a small annual salary. No provision, however, was made for feeding and for years the duck doctor has been getting contributions from neighboring farmers and grain opera-



### Not A Job For Congress

Disclosures and rumors of dirty work in professional sports have finally reached Capitol Hill. There they have so aroused Senator O'Mahoney of Wyoming that he has asked for a congressional investigation of the whole

Two things in particular perturb O'Mahoney: the inroads of gambling and the suspicion that there may be some monopolistic features about the operation of big league baseball. But are they important enough to warrant diverting the time and energies of several members from the urgent work confronting the new Congress?

Most states have laws covering gambling, and police to enforce them. More important, perhaps, almost every professional sport has its own regulatory officers. They may or may not be functioning as alertly and efficiently as possible. But at any rate the necessary means for in-

vestigation and punishment are already in existence. O'Mahoney's mention of monopoly in connection with baseball seems to have been inspired by the Detroit American League club's sale of Hank Greenberg to Pittsburgh in the National League after all the American League clubs had agreed to let the high-salaried, hard-hitting but somewhat aging player go. Perhaps the senator is unduly apprehensive. It may be said, without going into detail, that this was not a new maneuver, and that it has been logically explained.

It should be borne in mind that no one can be more interested in keeping professional sports on the level than the executives who make their livings from them. The sports public is fickle and emotional. Let it get noised around on good authority that players and games are reg-ularly being "fixed", and the fans will raise a howl and stay away in droves.

An exception should be made in the case of professional wrestling, which is so trumped-up as to resemble a vaudeville performance more than an athletic contest. Fans flock to the matches for the laughs. There is no gambling trouble. One might as well bet on the ending of "Uncle Tom's Cabin".

It should also be remembered that sports, like many other enterprises, have enjoyed an easy-money boom during and after the war. But the lush spenders are getting scarcer. With prospects of a more selective purchase of sports tickets ahead, it is likely that the sports bigwigs will be more alert to keep their attractions clean and competitive, and attractive to the buyer.

Gambling in sports exists, certainly. But it is not beyond the power of the sports themselves to root it out. What seems needed is a tougher stand by those now in authority, or their replacement by men who can be tough. There were no gambling scandals when the late Judge Landis was baseball's high commissioner. His code of rectitude was as unyielding as his granite profile, and he could set all baseball, from rookie players to league presidents, quaking in their boots when his dander was up.

If the sports executives and promoters don't clean out the gamblers it will be money out of their own pockets. But the situation is not one of grave national concern.

We're told there will be plenty of work for everybody this year. Just as some folks feared!







Vacuum Cotton

Picker Inspired

the Eskimos has nothing on August Zock, pioneer automotive engineer and inventor, who has developed a vacuum cotton harvesting machine in his shop on the frigid shores of Lake Superior. A quarter of a century research

study and experimentation by the patient Zock stands behind the harvester which has been successfully tested in Alabama and Texas cotton fields. Paradoxically it was a Northern

winter and a rotary-vacuum type snowplow which inspired Zock to develop his harvester when he moved to Michigan's northern peninsula. He had moved here to "hole in," weary and ill after more than 40 years in the automobile industry, and had established his retrea near Neomokong on the pine-stud-ded shores of Whitefish Bay. Snowplow Spurred Him

Watching the plume of snow spouting from a rotary plow reminded Zock of his plans and mod-

els for the cotton harvester.

Zock's harvester, which he hopes
to sell for less than \$1,000, is similar to a vacuum cleaner in principle, and is designed so that by minor adjustment it will do a three-fold job in the field-dusting the growing plant, defoliaging, and harvesting the boll.

Unlike other harvesters, Zock's machine is not entirely automatic, and its purpose is to aid the plan-tation hand by speeding up his picking of the bolls.

The machine consists of a high wheeled tractor, powered by a light gasoline engine which also supplies energy for the vacuum motor.

It is equipped with nozzles for two pickers and is capable of picking two rows of cotton at a time. The machine straddles a row of cotton, and each picker covers one side of the center row, and one side of the outside rows.

Separator's The Secret The vacuum is sufficiently powerful that a touch of the nozzle to a ripened boll will suck it through the hose, into a cleaner, which separates the cotton from the dirt and debris.

"I built my machine to aid the small cotton farmer," explains Zock. "I saw that unripened bolls were destroyed or damaged in other types of equipment, and it finally dawned on me that a machine to aid the picker would be the an-

Made It Himself A machinist since he was 17 years of age, Zock did much of the work on his harvester.

In field tests Zock found that two men can do the work of eight, with the operators less tired than if they had picked by hand. He says the harvester does an excellent job on "storm cotton," those bolls which have dropped to the ground during high winds or rain. He hopes to have 10 of his ma-


chines in the fields by next June.
