## David Lilienthal Has Run TVA His Way And In Doing So Won Political Foes, Including Senator McKellar


big man, a stout man in the root TVA's birth. ense of the word, a pleasant, roundfaced man, spectacled. He grins, wide and shrewd, and there is none the wide-eyed staring of the Utopian in his eyes. He can laugh as well as talk."

That is a capsule impression of David Eli Lilienthal by a Southern-er who has had good opportunity to watch his career with the Ten-

nessee Valley Authority. It is the same Lilienthal, nominated by the President to head the Atomic Energy Commission, who is under bitter attack by another Southerner.
What in Lilienthal's record quali-

fied him as Truman's choice for the vital post as custodian of one of the greatest of all scientific discoveries? And what in this man's record aroused such antagonism that certain senators should stake their political futures, perhaps, in an effort to get him out of public office?

The Southerner who painted the graphic word miniature of Lilienthal is North Carolina's Jonathan Daniels, who studied Lilienthal from his vantage point as newspaperman and one-time White House advisor. The Southerner who is spearheading the battle against Lilienthal is Tennessee's Senator Kenneth Mc-

Looking back, experts now agree that Lilienthal stood for getting voluntary cooperation of local peoples affected by TVA, to achieve its ends. Impatient with this approach, his critics and foes would have had TVA set methods and standards, believed to be best for the people, and insist on compliance.

Lilienthal eventually had his way

and what TVA has accomplished good or bad, has mostly been done in his manner, simply expressed in his statement that he has "no confidence in progress that comes from plans concocted by supermen and imposed upon the rest of the community for its own good."

One of Lilienthal's main theories

on running TVA was that its management should be as non-political as possible. "TVA" if politically managed could become a curse to

this valley," he said.
Insistence on this point won Lilienthal his most ardent enemy. Senator McKellar, since TVA started, has fought for a right to have a major say on just who was to get on TVA's payroll. Most of McKellar's efforts in this direction were blocked by Lilienthal.

At the start of the war Lilienthal had another major brush with Mc-Kellar. Lilienthal decided to build a new dam which would produce 100,000 kilowatts of power for pro-duction of aluminum. The project involved flooding approximately 12,-000 acres of fruit land owned by the canning industry, which had always faithfully supported McKellar. McKellar was unsuccessful in blocking construction of the dam.

He retaliated by unsuccessful efforts to abolish TVA's revolving fund and by other means.

Long A Utility Expert
Lilienthal was appointed to TVA
on the reputation he had made as a member of the Wisconsin Public Service Commission, a job he got in 1931 when he was already a recognized expert on utility legisla-tion. This knowledge he used to reorganize the Commission and revise the State's utility laws so they be-came a model for many other

Before he took his Wisconsin job, Lilienthal was a fairly well known figure in Chicago. Working part time for the city government, he had won a \$20,000,000 refund for the town's telephone subscribers by proving to the satisfaction of the U. S. Supreme Court that the telephone company had made that much overcharge. He also wrote for

legal journals and practiced law.
Practically everything Lilienthal
has done has contributed to his
reputation as a fighter. At DePauw
University in Indiana he fought for and won a Phi Beta Kappa key, and more literally, won a reputa-tion as a light heavyweight boxer. He was graduated from Harvard

Law School in 1923. He was born in Morton, Ill., July 8, 1899. He and his wife, the former Helen Marian Lamb, have two children, a daughter, Nancy Alice, a graduate of Radcliffe College, who works for the Department of Labor, and a son, David Eli, Jr., a student at Harvard. Lilienthal is of the


