

**High Cost Of Higher Learning** 

All of America's educational headaches aren't in the public schools. They're worse there, of course, with too few qualified teachers and too little money to pay them. But the colleges have their troubles, too. And these seem likely to grow worse as the public school problems are solved.

What the colleges are up against is told in the current issue of School and Society by W. Emerson Reck, public relations director at Colgate University. The article is the outcome of a survey of 124 colleges in 34 states which Reck conducted under sponsorship of the Society for the Advancement of Education and the American College Public Relations Association.

Parents and students may have wondered why, with a bumper enrollment of veterans, most colleges have raised their tuition. Alumni may have become impatient at the continuing appeals for donations from alma mater. Lem Nichols Is New Reck explains the money famine in the midst of plenteous enrollment.

The influx of more than 1,000,000 ex-GIs has made necessary a heavy outlay for college housing. In addition, extra clerical help for extra paper work has put the cost of educating a veteran 10 to 15 per cent above that Breckenridge, this week assumed of a non-veteran student.

This helps to explain why the average college's expenses are up 52 per cent over prewar (some schools re- with the grocery business, having port expense increases of from 100 to 400 per cent), while tuition was up only 19.7 per cent.

Almost half the colleges questioned by Reck have had to seek extra funds. They have either borrowed from banks, used current gifts, or conducted special campaigns. Some have done all three.

Most college presidents, Reck found, are fearful of the future. What is going to happen, they ask, if labor and material costs and salaries continue to rise when the so-called GI boom is over? Most colleges will be left with over-developed plants, some of them of poor wartime or postwar construction. Tuition can't be raised indefinitely to meet higher costs. For college administrators, in their role of businessmen, have the businessman's fear of "pricing themselves out of the market".

Suggested solutions are public subsidy for state and municipal colleges, private subsidy for the others, and possibly legislation creating federal scholarships without federal control of education.

As President Charles J. Turck of Macalester College puts it, "The large fortunes that sustained colleges have been depleted by taxation or divided by inheritance. New donors on the grand scale are hard to locate and to interest. The outlook ahead of the small college is not good. . . . New friends must be found"

So it seems that higher education, like almost every other American commodity, is in for a permanent price rise. And since America cannot exist as a great nation without her colleges, there's nothing for her citizens to do-as taxpayers, alumni, or philanthropists-but dig down and shell out.





## Influenza Cases Increase In Midland

The number of influenza cases in Midland last week increased 260 per cent over the previous week. One hundred and seventy-five cases here. were reported last week by Midland doctors to the Midland County Health Unit, while only 67 cases were reported the preceding week.

Dr. F. E. Sadler, director of the Midland - Ector - Howard County structors on an improved job of Health Unit, said Tuesday the feeding and showing. number of cases in the city is increasing fast. The supreme commander told American correspondents Monday that a peace treaty 'with Japan should be made soon, the occupation terminated, and future guidance of the country turned over to the United Nations.

Some young intellectuals were concerned lest withdrawal of American occupation forces would stimulate stronger political activity by extremists and checkmate growth of democracy.
