

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The House passed Thursday a Republican-backed bill slashing income taxes this year by almost \$4,000,000,000. The legislation now goes to the Senate, where it probably will be revised. The tax slash—if the Senate and President Truman approve it-would be retroactive to January 1. It would cut taxes of 25,000,000 lower income persons by 30 per cent and give 20 per cent reduction to most others among the 46,000,000 taxpayers.

MOSCOW — (AP) — Under the impact of the three Western nations' arguments, Soviet Foreign Minister Molotov retreated from his previous position and agreed Thursday to consider a definition of German assets in Austria.

AUSTIN -(AP) The House decided Thursday to investigate "deplorable" incidents which have occurred at Texas A&M College during the past month. Representatives voted 90-31 for a resolution calling for a five-member committee to "receive first hand information from all parties concerned in these deplorable incidents and report its findings back to this house."

Soak 21/2 tablespoons gelatine in 1/2 cup cold water. Stir over heat until sugar is dissolved:

1/2 cup water Dissolve the gelatine in hot syrup. Cool it. Add the contents of:

2 (91/2 oz.) cans grapefruit juice

3 tablespoons lemon juice

1/2 cup sherry 1/4 teaspoon salt Pour these ingredients into a well-oiled 9-inch ring mold. Chill the jelly until it is firm. Turn it out on a platter. Fill the center with watermelon balls. If watermelon is not available, substitute soft cream cheese balls rolled in chopped nuts. Garnish the outer edge of the platter with alligator pear slices alternating with skinned grapefruit or orange sections on watercress or shred-ded lettuce. Sprinkle it with pomegranate seeds. Serve the salad with mayonnaise and French dressing.

(Serves 6)
Two cups sifted cake flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, ½ teaspoon salt, 1/8 teaspoon powdered cloves, 8 tablespoons fortified margarine or butter, 4 to 5 tablespoons

garine or butter, 4 to 5 tablespoons ice water.

Sift together flour, baking powder, salt, cloves. Add 4 tablespoons fortified margarine or butter and cut into flaky bits through the flour, using pastry blender or 2 knives. Stir in ice water sufficient to make a well blended but not soft dough. Roll out to 1/4 inch thickness. Spread with half the thickness. Spread with half the remaining margarine or butter. Fold in thirds. Again roll out to about 1/4 inch thickness. Spread with remaining 2 tablespoons margarine or butter, fold in thirds. Roll out 1/4 inch thickness. Cut with scalloped cutter, making 18 little shortcakes. Bake on biscuit sheet in hot oven (400 degrees F.) about 10 minutes. Brush or spread with extra margarine or butter. Put together as triple decker with crushed sweentened strawberries between and over the top.





U. S. Banks On

TRIESTE-(AP)-A new abbreviation you might as well get used to

is "TRUST."
That will be the U.S. Army's short name for the force of 5,000 GT's which, along with like-sized British and Yugoslav detachments, will be stationed in the Trieste Free City zone to help its governor-yet

However, the Army admits that soldiers are likely to give the force its unofficial handle, "Blue Devil Researches in the Western Colo-rado oil shale area reveal 300,000,-name Axis Sally hung on the 000 barrels of oil per square mile, brigade's parent division, the 88th, for the fury of its fighting during

the Italian campaign.

The 88th is now the major American occupation force in Venezia Giulia, the area on Italy's northwestern frontier which the Italian peace treaty divvies up among Italy, Yugoslavia, and the

Trieste Free City.

Maj. Gen. Bryant E. Moore, commanding the 88th, will also command "TRUST," at least until the division ships out for home, with Brig. Gen. Ridgely B. Gaither, now assistant divisional commander, active commander of the brigade itself, and Col. Numa A. Watson, now 88th chief of staff, commanding the infantry regiment which will be its backbone.

Present plans call for most U. S. troops to be billeted in the northern part of the free zone, with few in Trieste itself. However, Army and Red Cross are vieing with each other to provide recreational facilities in Trieste, and the Triestini will see plenty off-duty GI's.

While British troops will police
most of Trieste itself, the Ameri-
