AMERADA'S DISCOVERY IN TERRY SWABBED NEW OIL Amerada Petroleum Corporation

No. 1 Sam Adair, wildcat discovery in South Terry County, about 15 miles south of Brownfield, swabbed 245 barrels of new oil in a 24-hour period, after washing casing perforations at 4,850-4,925 feet, with 500 gallons of mud acid, and was preparing to treat the pay section with 3,000 gallons of acid.

This prospective pool opener, lo cated 660 feet from south and west lines of section 4, block C-37, psl survey, and approximately miles northwest of the Cedar Lake field, loaded the hole with 107 barrels of oil, prior to the 500-gallon mud acid washing.

The acid was swabbed out to pits and then in seven hours 118 barrels of fluid was swabbed out. It was cut with an average of five per cent drilling mud.

The discovery then swabbed to tanks for 24 hours-ending at about 7 a.m., Monday. During that time recovery was 245 barrels of fluid, cut an average of four per cent sediment and drilling water. The remainder was new

It will be 330 feet from south and 2,310 feet from west lines of Section 27, block 3, H&GN survey. The lease on which the drillsite is located shows on some maps to be owned by The Ohio Oil Company. Apparently, Crabb has made a deal with that concern covering the drilling of the prospector.

Underground cables also will be placed on Big Spring Street from

Wall to Michigan Streets. The new cables will provide for the installation of six new switchboards and approximately 1,100 additional numbers at the telephone exchange. The project, when completed, will take care of practically all demands for telephone service

All new cables will be placed in the underground conduits which are sufficiently large to allow for additional growth, Fox said. A total of 145,000 feet of cable is involved

in the project. The Big Spring Street and East Front Street conduits eventually will eliminate the need of open wire lines and poles in those sectors. The company also plans to bring its toll cables underground East Front Street to the exchange

tract is seven spades. What is the safest way to play the hand to make the contract? Larry Hirsch, one of the winners of the Vanderbilt Cup tournament, played this hand in a rubber bridge game. He won the opening lead in dummy with the ace of hearts, led the seven of clubs and won in his

own hand with the king. Now he trumped the deuce of clubs in dummy with the four of



spades, and returned to his hand with a diamond. The four of clubs was played and West showed out. Hirsch trumped with dummy's nine of spades, cashed the queen of spades, and then could ruff either a heart or diamond, pick up the adverse trumps, and all of his clubs were good.

If he had attempted to cross-ruff the hand out, he could not have counted to thirteen. His line of play also protected against four clubs in the West hand. If West had not shown out on the third round, Hirsch could have trumped with the queen of spades in dummy Then of course he would have had to get a three-two break in the GENERAL STORE trump suit.
