Interim Status Of Dominion Is **India Solution**

LONDON -(AP)- The British government announced Tuesday it will transfer power in India to the Indians almost immediately and leave it to the Indian people to decide whether there shall be one or two governments. Legislation will be introduced

during the present session of Parliament for the transfer of power this year-on a dominion status basis-to one or two Indian governments, depending on which system the Indian people subscribe to. Thus until the absolute withdrawal of the British, scheduled for July, 1948, India will be composed of one or two self-governing coun-

ish Commonwealth of Nations. Briefly, the machinery for cettling the question of partition in the Moslem areas will be as fol-

1. Indian members of the provincial legislative assemblies of Ben-gal and Punjab will be asked to meet in two parts, one represent ing Moslem majority districts and the other the other areas of the provinces. If either part decides by a majority vote in favor of par tition, division will take place. 2. If—as expected — partition

decided upon, a boundary commission will be set up by the governor-general, in consultation with leaders of the major political-religious groups, to split the parti-tioned provinces into Moslem and





More Than The Price Tag
