A Sofia dispatch quoted an authoritative source as saying "probably Bulgaria will participate" the conference, which opens in Paris Saturday. The dispatch said the Bulgarian council of ministers vas meeting to reach a decision in the matter.

Despite a Moscow radio report Yugoslavia had rejected the invitation to participate, observers in Belgrade said the Yugoslavs still had not replied, and probably would not do so before Thursday.

The United Nations Security Council Tuesday approved an American blueprint for arms reduction discussions despite a Russian warning the plan would bring about a collapse of arms regulation efforts.

The vote was 9 to 0, with Russia and Poland abstain-

In view of Russia's firm stand against the U.S. plan it had been believed she might invoke the big power veto to block it.

Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko gave his warning before the council in a new effort to revive the Soviet working plan which already had been rcected by the commission for conrentional armaments.

His challenge was taken up promptly by French De'egate Alex-andre Parodi and U. S. Represenative Herschel V. Johnson, who announced their opposition to any substitute for the American plan. Atomic Bomb Question

Gromyko insisted no program for arms regulation could succeed unwith an absolute prohibition of atomic weapons.

He declared the U.S. plan did not link the problems of arms reduction and the banning of atomic weapons and, for this reason, it

offered no basis for a solution. Gromyko opened debate on the arms question as delegates awaited another major declaration from him later in the day in reply to United States and British demands critical Balkan situation.

Delegates agreed they were approaching perhaps the gravest moment in UN history.

"It is obvious," Gromyko added, the commission cannot work out a plan without linking it to atomic

As a result Congress has enacted a new labor law intended to curb such actions.

It is all very well for Petrillo to say, "The Supreme Court has spoken, and I bow to its dictates." That is commendable. But he and some other heads of unions might well recall that the Supreme Court is only one of three equal and equally important branches of government.

When Congress passes a law, or the Executive Department enforces it, or the Judicial Department judges it, the government has spoken in each case. If the law is unjust it can be amended or nullified.

But this immediate defiance by one group of an act of the people's government weakens the people's government. Such defiance may be within the law. But it is rebellion, not criticism.



The acreage of American-Egyptian cotton in cultivation July 1 was estimated at 1,300 compared with 3,100 last year and with 70,700 for the 10-year average.

Louisiana was up 3,350 barrels to 428,100, Kansas gained 1,950 to 290,-600 and New Mexico production increased 1,210 to 107,210. Mississippi decreased 890 to 95,510.

Like Poland. Czechoslovakia is in the Soviet sphere but without Soviet troops. Russian opposition to a line of action which the Czechs believe to be in their own economic interests could cause great trouble in that country

Italy—The Italian government like the French was reorganized last Spring without Communist participation. But the Communist Party is strong and in a position to bring powerful opposition against any government policy it disapproves. If Moscow so orders, it might try to make Italian participation in organized European recovery relatively ineffective.


