

HOW TO USE THE TELEPHONE SKILLFULLY

Even the simplest things—and telephoning is one of them—are easier and more satisfactory for the person who knows the best way to do them and then DOES them that way.



#### Serve Beef Round In Different Ways

By GAYNOR MADDOX

NEA Staff Writer Beef round is always one of the best buys. But it can get monotonous unless you try new recipes. Savory Steak (Serves 4-5)

Flour, 21/2 pounds beef round one inch, thick, 4 slices bacon, 11/2 teaspoons salt, 1/8 teaspoon pepper, 11/2 cups boiling water, 2 tablespoons ketchup, 12 teaspoon pre pared mustard, 1 sliced small onion. Pound as much flour as possible into both sides of the beef. Fry bacon until crisp. Remove bacon and brown beef on both sides in bacon fat. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Then combine boiling water, ketchup and mustard and pour over the beef. Add onion, cover and simmer about 11/2 hours or until tender. Remove meat to hot platter. Thicken gravy, using tablespoons flour mixed with tablespoons water for every cupful of liquid. Add salt and pepper to taste and pour over meat. Stuffed roast shoulder of lamb is an impressive and reasonable company dish. Try this special stuf-

Spinach-Rice And Mushroom Stuffing

(Serves 4-6) One large onion, chopped, 1/2 pound mushrooms, cut up, 1/3 cup fat, 11/2 pounds spinach, chopped, 2 cups cooked rice (use about 3/4 cup raw rice)), 1 teaspoon thyme, egg, well beaten, salt and pepper

Brown onion and mushrooms in fat; combine with rest of ingredients in the order given. Fill lamb shoulder cavity with stuffing. Sew edges together and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Place on a rack in an open roasting pan and roast at 325 degree Fahrenheit, allowing 45 minutes per pound.



#### Hard Job Of Education

Six Months

A majority of the UN commission which investigated the border fighting in Greece held Yugoslavia chiefly to blame for the frontier incidents, with Bulgaria and Albania responsible to a lesser extent. The vote approving these conclusions was 9 to 2. Russia and Poland abstained.

Now the Soviet government, through its representative, Gromyko, has offered the Security Council a dif-ferent proposal for settling the Balkan dispute. It starts out by rejecting the UN commission's findings and holding the Greek government entirely responsible—on the basis of the commission's investigation.

This odd reasoning is not Gromyko's, of course, but his superiors'. Still it might be suspected, from the Soviet representative's angry speech which accompanied the proposal, that it all seemed perfectly logical to him. This is not very encouraging, if true. But neither is it very re-

Andrei Gromyko was eight years old when the Communist Party took over in Russia. He is one of a new generation reared and nourished on Soviet ideology. That generation has been taught to suspect and reject not only non-Communist politics and economics, but also non-Communist thinking.

Among the rejected concepts is the acceptance of majority decisions. In Russia's political and economic life there are two sides to every question-the right, or government, side, and the wrong one. The party sanctions no opposition.

Suggestion, debate and differences of opinion seem to be permitted in minor matters. But on any matter of major policy there is no such freedom. The party-government decrees, and the citizens must obey.

This is not a new system. It is ancient absolutism. Most of Russia's neighbors discovered long ago that the way to avoid constant turmoil or severe repressions in national life was to let both sides have their say on a question. The resulting decision by a majority of the people or their representatives won't leave everybody happy. But there will be fewer dangerous frustrations and disappointments.

Democracy puts its faith in the collective wisdom of the majority. Communism insists on the collective obedience of all. Each system is foreign to the other. Yet both can and must exist side-by-side on a national basis.


When these systems clash in world deliberations, real trouble starts. Gromyko, in the United Nations, shows that he feels his government is absolutely right in international as well as national affairs, and that its decisions must be obeyed. If the rest of the UN takes the opposite view, no matter-he will sulk, denounce, abstain, veto or walk out. Gracious acceptance of majority opinion seems beyond his comprehension.

It is men like Gromyko who soon will be running Russia. Generalissimo Stalin and his contemporaries are the architects of Russian communism, not its products. They deliberately planted the idea of government infallibility. It has now flowered into a national state of mind. And it is not a state of mind which lends itself to peaceful, productive world relations.

There seems no discernible way to combat this ideology except by the continuous pressure of world opinion. That does not mean that Russia will always be wrong or that all her policies should be opposed. It means that FORCED PEANUT FARMING Russia somehow will have to be convinced that world deliberations must really be worldwide.

The UN cannot go very far, even in strengthening itself, until Russia comes to realize that, in world decisions, a deadlock is not the only alternative to a unanimous approval. The process of bringing Russia to that realiza-

LAKE SUCCESS - (AP) - Watching the Security Council try to pick a world police force for the United Nations is like listening to a bad phonograph record.

The music comes out pretty as you please until a certain point. Then the needle sticks, and all you hear is a griding noise—"ur-r-r-ruh, ur-r-r-ruh, ur-r-r-ruh."
