Approximately \$22,000,-000 of government funds have been expended or obligated on this photo-reconnaissance plane This amount includes \$8,600,000 in termination costs.'





Right Advice, Wrong Audience

At a time when the coal mine operators were signing their new contract with John L. Lewis and the UMW, Matthew Woll, American Federation of Labor vice president, was explaining the new AFL wage-price policy to a congressional committee.

"It is the feeling of the AFL," he said, "that moderate increases in wages in 1947, accompanied by a price-reduction policy, industry by industry, according to their ability to lower prices, will assure continuous prosperity and high levels of production and employment.

"It is obvious that a wage policy that would attempt to keep wages up with the soaring price of food is not sound. . . . Further, a wage policy that made price reductions impossible would militate against the workers' own interests by devaluating workers' insurance policies, fixed social security benefits and fixed pensions for their older

Those are wise words. It seems a pity that Woll didn't speak them earlier, and speak them to his fellow AFL vice president, Lewis. Still, it probably wouldn't have done any good. For Lewis is a law unto himself, in or out of the AFL. With a strangle hold on an indispensable ingredient of most of our industry, he has the power to make his own policy.

The new inflationary contract which the operators signed is, of course, in direct contradiction to the policy which Woll announced. Lewis has not stopped with trying to tie wages to high prices. He has soared above those high prices with a wage increase that will drag prices

The UMW president figures that, with all benefits included, the miners' pay has actually been increased by \$3.54 a day. If 400,000 miners work 40 five-day weeks in the coming year, that \$3.54 a day will mean an added cost to the operators of \$283,200,000. You're not going to get any price reductions with that kind of an increase not in any item that uses coal or steel in its production.

There have been charges that this contract represents collusion between Lewis and the big coal operators. It has been suggested that the latter knew that the added cost would be passed along in higher prices, and that they

Yet what could the operators do? They had the choice of signing this contract and adding to inflation or risking another paralyzing strike. One can scarcely blame them for their decision under those circumstances.

Now it only remains to be seen how often Lewis will condescend to let his minors work. The slick clause in the agreement, whereby the miners will work when they are "willing and able," guarantees no performance on their

Perhaps the "willing and able" clause will run into trouble with the new Taft-Hartley Labor Law. But one thing is certain. Under this law which he has denounced so thunderously, Lewis has put through what he admits is the best contract in the history of "free collective bar-

This notable achievement puts another hand into every purse and pocket so that less than .3 per cent of our population may benefit slightly at the expense of all the rest of the nation.

The statement seems to us unfortunate, and for two reasons. First, it indicates a state of mind which sees the holiday less as a deserved rest for the workers than as a chance to slap an unofficial fine on the bosses.

In the second place, we think the statement tends to deceive the public and the union membership. Probably the mass vacable isn't really going to cost the employers brothers, J. L. Neal of Burbank, a penny. The \$19,000,000 is simply an added labor cost Calif., and Tom Neal of St. John's, that will be reflected in higher prices for men's clothingincluding the clothing that the members of the clothing workers union must buy.

Certainly the clothing workers, and all workers, deserve a vacation. But the insistence on this mass walkout for a fortnight's recreation adds to the living costs of practically all men in the country—with the possible exception of the manufacturers of men's clothing.

Secrets—Tell Them Or Keep Them

Senator Hickenlooper, who revealed the theft of documents from the Los Alamos atom bomb project, hints that there is more to the story than that. He has spoken mysteriously of national and international developments of vital importance. He has warned that additional responsibilities, studies and investigations must be undertaken in connection with our atomic secrets.

It seems to us that it might be better if he would explain these hints and warnings or, if that is impossible, say nothing publicly. Senator Hickenlooper is too intelligent and responsible a man to indulge in this childish "I know a secret" attitude. It only increases the public anxiety without contributing anything to the public knowl-


